### Application Made for Bridge Work Pursuant to *The Canadian Navigable Waters Act*

The City of Saskatoon hereby gives public notice that an application has been made to the Minister of Transport, pursuant to *The Canadian Navigable Waters Act* for approval of the work described herein and its site and plans.

Pursuant to paragraph 7(2) of the said Act, **Stantec Consulting Ltd.** has deposited with the Minister of Transport, on the on-line Common Project Search Registry (<http://cps.canada.ca/>) and under registry number 9920, or, under the NPP File Number 2014-600140, a description of the following work, its site and plans:

- **Bridge in, on, over, under, through or across South Saskatchewan River at University Bridge located between Spadina Crescent and Clarence Avenue.**

## Official Community Plan Notice Saskatoon North Partnership for Growth (P4G) Planning District Proposed P4G Official Community Plan Amendment

Public notice is hereby given that the Rural Municipality (R.M.) of Corman Park, Town of Osler, City of Martensville, City of Saskatoon, and City of Warman Councils will consider amendments under *The Planning and Development Act, 2007* to amend R.M. of Corman Park Bylaw 57/20, Town of Osler Bylaw 2020-08, City of Martensville Bylaw 12/2020, City of Saskatoon Bylaw 9720, and City of Warman Bylaw 2020-09, known as the P4G Planning District Official Community Plan (P4G DOCP).

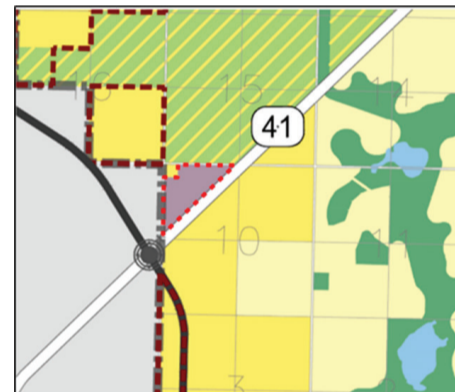
### INTENT

For each member municipality to adopt a corresponding bylaw (R.M. of Corman Park Bylaw 45/23, Town of Osler Bylaw 2024-05, City of Martensville Bylaw 5-2024, City of Warman Bylaw 2024-01, and City of Saskatoon Bylaw 9964) to amend the P4G District Official Community Plan by re-designating on NW 10-37-4-W3 Ext 5, Blk/Par A, B, D, E, F, G, H, J, and Roads within Plan 102331639, from 'Urban Residential Neighbourhood' land use to 'Rural Commercial/Industrial' land use as shown within the bold dashed line on Schedule B. The amendment will support future rural commercial development instead of future neighbourhood development.

For each member municipality to adopt a corresponding bylaw (R.M. of Corman Park Bylaw 49/23, Town of Osler Bylaw 2024-06, City of Martensville Bylaw 6-2024, City of Warman Bylaw 2024-02, and City of Saskatoon Bylaw 9965) to amend the P4G District Official Community Plan by removing on NW 10-37-4-W3 Ext 5, Blk/Par A, B, D, E, F, G, H, J, and Roads within Plan 102331639, the Growth area to 1,000,000 Future Urban Growth Area designation as shown within the bold dashed line on Schedule C. The amendment is required as the land use is changing from urban to rural on Schedule B.

The affected lands are within the R.M. of Corman Park located immediately northeast of the City of Saskatoon as shown below.
