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Annual Report of Business Information for the City of Saskatoon

Business License Program

The City of Saskatoon Business License Program, Community Services Department, licenses all businesses operating from a fixed address within Saskatoon. This includes all home based businesses and all businesses operating from commercial and industrial locations.

The Business License Program processes over 7,200 new business applications and license renewals annually. All data contained in this publication was obtained by the City of Saskatoon through the Business License Program.

Business Profile provides a summary of business activity in Saskatoon, including information on

- commercial/industrial businesses (those operating in traditional business areas),



- new businesses,
- home based businesses,
- employment data, and
- the Online Business Directory.

Total Licensed Businesses

In 2004, there was a total of 7,231 licensed businesses in Saskatoon. Table 1 identifies the total number of home based businesses and commercial/industrial businesses licensed by the Business License Program from 1999 to 2004.

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New Businesses

The City of Saskatoon Business License Program issued 873 new business licenses in 2004. Table 2 summarizes the number of new business licenses issued for the years 1999 to 2004.

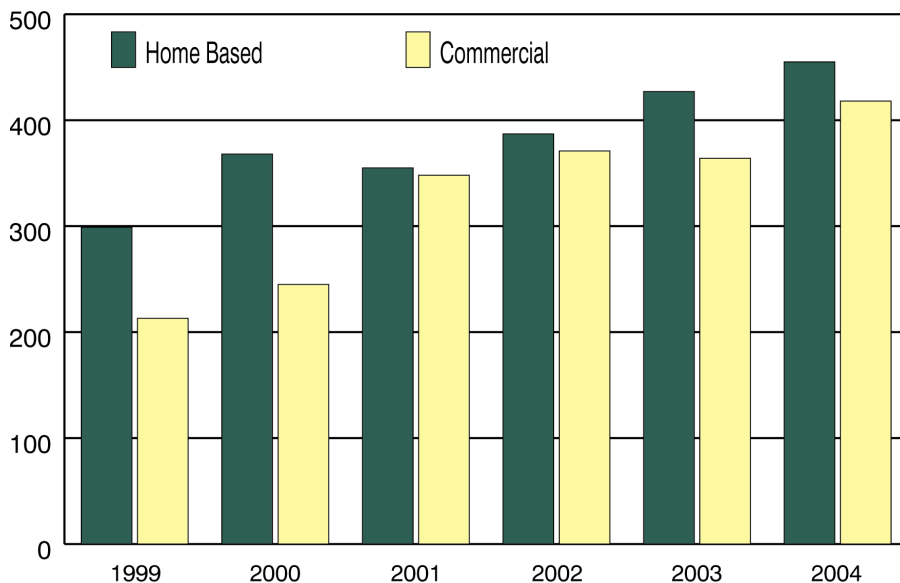


Figure 1: New Licensed Businesses, 1999–2004

As shown in Figure 1, the number of new licensed home based businesses continues to exceed the number of new licensed commercial/industrial businesses.

Table 3 represents the number of new commercial and industrial business license applications approved by major business sector for 1999 through 2004.

Table 4 represents the number of new home based business license applications approved by major business sector for the years 1999 to 2004. Home based businesses are classified under six major business sector types:

- The **Building/Construction Related Sector** includes all commercial and residential contractors, plumbers, electricians, landscapers, home renovation experts, etc.
- The **Business/Professional Sector** includes insurance agents, web designers, accountants, lawyers, engineers, financial advisors, and many other related services.
- The **Health/Wellness/Education Sector** includes health and medical services such as massage therapists, nutritionists, psychologists, fitness consultants, instructors, and other teaching services.
- The **Manufacturing/Transport/Wholesale Sector** refers to the base of operations for limousine services, movers, wholesale distributors, etc.
- The **Personal/Household Sector** includes entertainers, artists, interior decorators, travel agents, etc.
- The **Repair/Maintenance Sector** includes janitorial services, handyman services, and other mobile repair services.

Quick facts

The City of Saskatoon Business License Bylaw requires all businesses, including home based businesses, to obtain a business license prior to starting operations.

Commercial/Industrial Businesses

In 2004, Saskatoon had a total of 5,240 licensed commercial/industrial businesses. Table 7 provides a breakdown of businesses by major business sector for the years 1999 to 2004.

Figure 2 illustrates the distribution of commercial/industrial businesses in Saskatoon by neighbourhood.

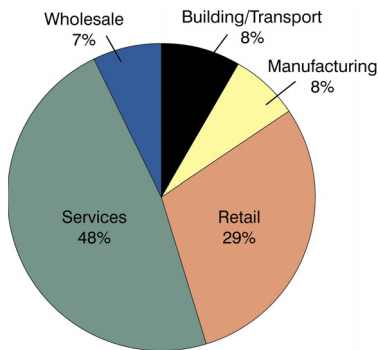


Figure 3: Distribution of Commercial/Industrial Businesses by Major Business Sector in 2004

Figure 3 illustrates the distribution of commercial/industrial businesses among the five major business sectors for 2004. The data in Table 7 indicates that this distribution has been consistent over the past several years. The Retail and Service Sectors continue to be the most prevalent.

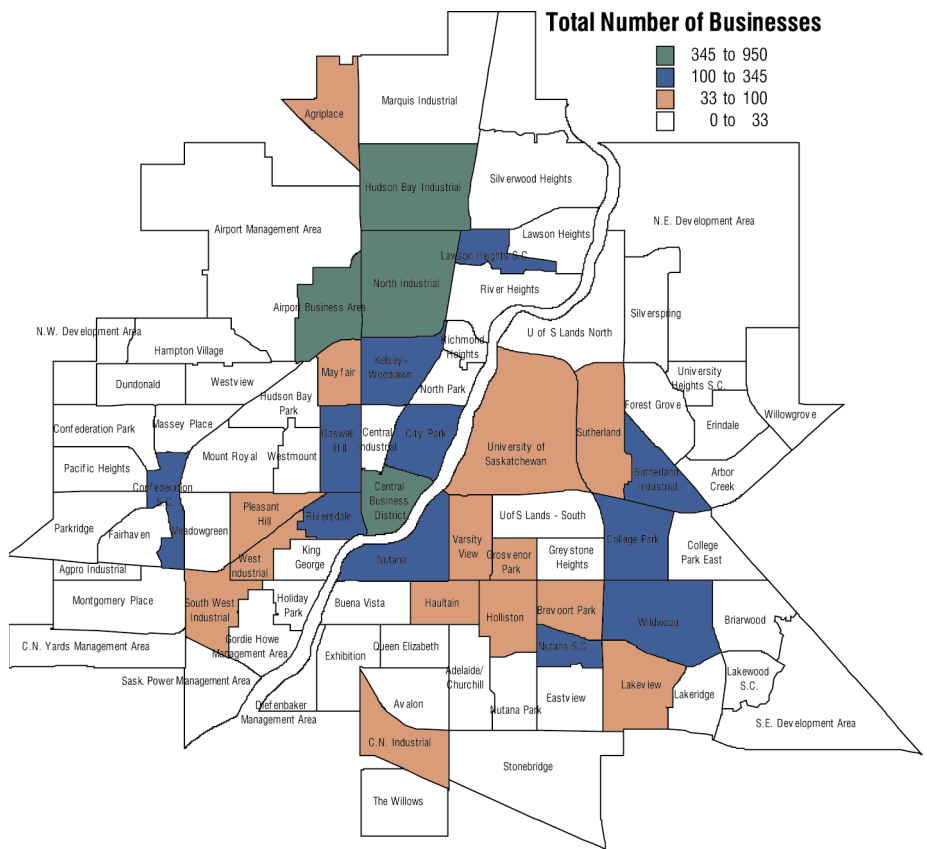
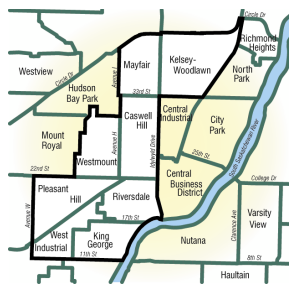


Figure 2: Distribution of Commercial/Industrial Businesses by Neighbourhood, 2004

The Enterprise Zone

consists of eight neighbourhoods that are at risk of falling further behind the rest of the city in terms of income, job creation, economic opportunities, property values, and some essential commercial services.

The Enterprise Zone includes the neighbourhoods of Westmount, Caswell Hill, King George, Riversdale, Pleasant



Hill, Mayfair, Kelsey-Woodlawn, and the West Industrial Area.

To encourage businesses to locate or expand their operations in the Enterprise Zone,

special programs and incentives have been designed to generate economic activity. As well, these incentives

encourage property owners and developers to invest in renovation, expansion, or creation of new housing. They also increase consumer and investor confidence in the Zone.

These programs were developed in consultation with community associations, local business groups, and other community stakeholders.

Special Projects

2004 Along with reviewing over 7,200 business licenses, the Business License Program managed to

- implement internal audit recommendations resulting in improvements to the recording of business activity in Saskatoon;
- continue the comprehensive review of the business license database and data collection techniques;
- survey non-profit and government agencies to obtain statistics on square footage and employee numbers;
- complete the pawn shop clustering review, including amendments to the Business License Bylaw;
- continue updating the Business License Program webpage;
- update the business license and home based business brochures; and
- provide support to the Online Business Directory.

2005 The special projects the Business License Program will be undertaking include

- investigating an online application and renewal process for business licenses;
- developing an online information resource to assist people starting a business in Saskatoon;
- updating the inventory of commercial space in Saskatoon;
- continuing the review and rewrite of the Business License Bylaw;
- continuing the comprehensive review of the business license database and data collection techniques;
- conducting a survey of commercial and industrial property to confirm vacancy rates;
- reviewing potential amendments to the Zoning Bylaw related to last year's pawn shop study; and
- providing a fall edition of *Business Profile*.

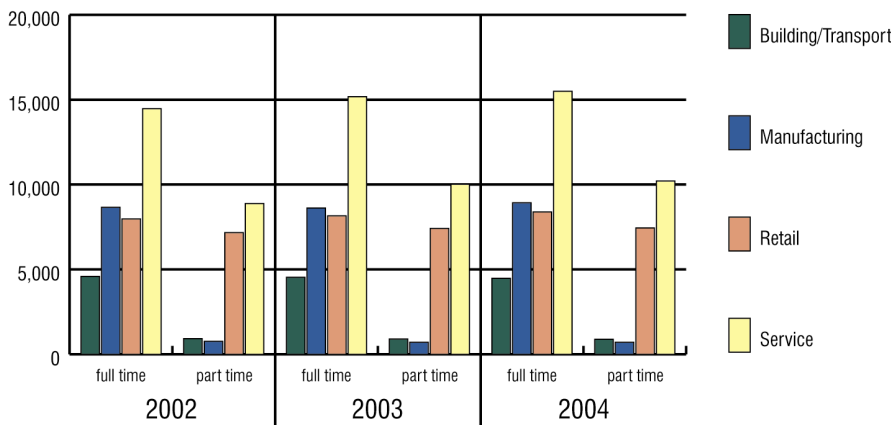


Figure 4: Comparative Employment Information, 2002–2004

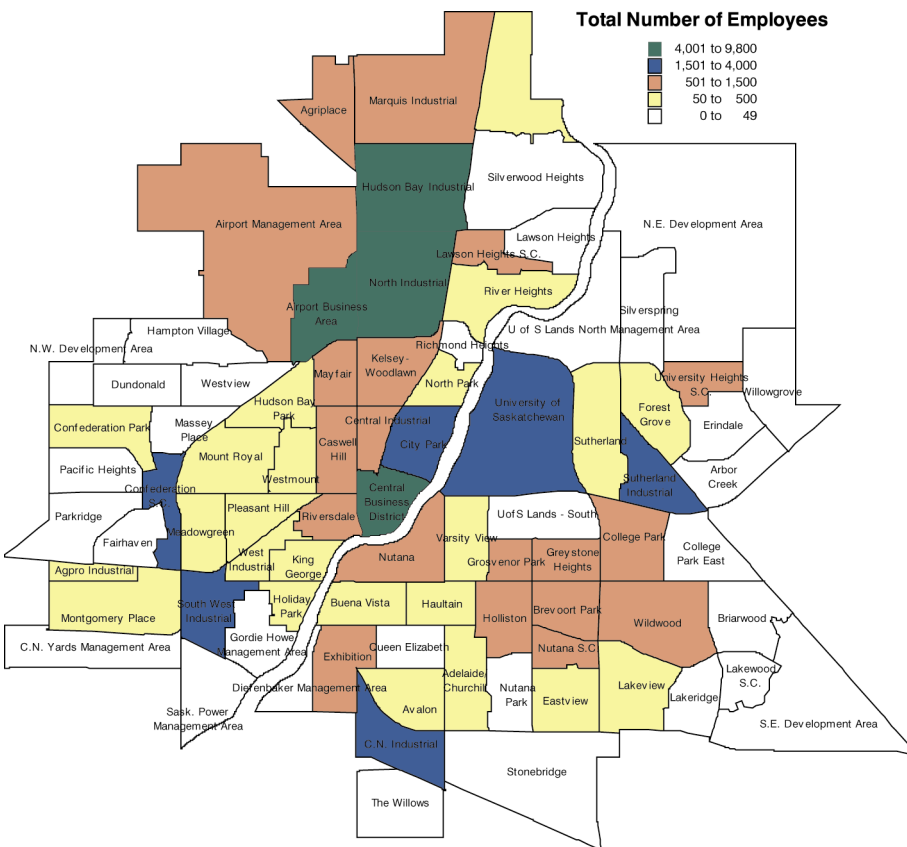


Figure 5: Number of Employees by Neighbourhood, 2004

Home Based Businesses

Home based businesses account for 28% of the total number of licensed businesses in Saskatoon.

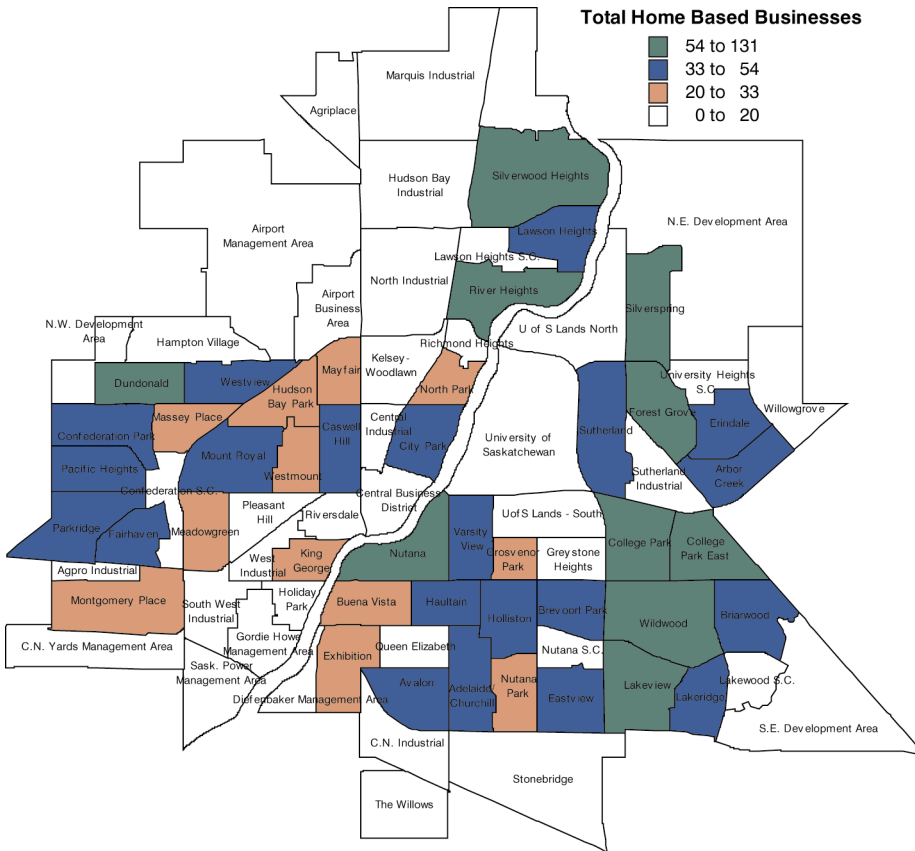


Figure 6: Number of Licensed Home Based Businesses by Neighbourhood, 2004

In 2004, there was a total of 1,991 licensed home based businesses in the city. This was an increase of 12% from the previous year. Figure 6 illustrates the number of licensed home based

businesses by neighbourhood in 2004.

Neighbourhoods experiencing the highest number of new home based business applications in 2004 were Silverwood Heights (32), Arbor Creek (16), River Heights (16), College Park (15), and Confederation Park (14).
