Gary Haywood spoke regarding the congestion on Central Avenue, specifically the southbound portion going from the north end of the city to Attridge Drive, and requested that the barricades be removed.

Whereas the southbound lanes of Central Avenue north of Attridge Drive have previously been opened to traffic; Whereas significant congestion over the winter has been experienced on this stretch of roadway; Therefore the Standing Policy Committee on Transportation requests that the Administration again requests that Graham Commuter Partners open the southbound lanes for the winter to alleviate traffic issues.

7.2.1 Transit – Intelligent Transportation System Software Upgrade – Award of Contract [Files CK 261-2, x 7300-1 and TR 7301-12]

7.2.2 Taxi Service Proposals and Regulation of Transportation Network Companies [Files CK 7000-1, x 307-4]

Councillor Gersher declared a conflict of interest on the above item due to her family's involvement in the business and left the Council Chamber.

Director of Corporate Revenue Sutherland together with Solicitor Kowalski reviewed the report and answered questions of the Committee.

Dale Gallant stated that Transportation Network Companies should be regulated the same as taxis, and requested a level playing field for small businesses in Saskatoon.

Carlo Triolo, General Manager, United Group of Companies, stated a level playing field means the same regulations for all and noted that Transportation Network Companies should be required to have a City business licence.

Shondra Boire, SK Taxi Cab Association and Operations Manager of Comfort Cabs, spoke regarding a made-in-Saskatchewan

approach in an effort to curb impaired driving, and also would only put vehicles for hire on the road when there is public demand.

Kelly Frie requested that the City ensure taxis and Transportation Network Companies are regulated on a level playing field, and noted public safety should be a priority, as well as criminal record checks by the Saskatoon Police Service should be required. Mr. Frie provided additional information which was distributed to the Committee.

Malik Umar Draz, President, USW Local 2014 requested that Transportation Network Companies follow the same set of rules as the taxi industry has been following for many years, and noted that affordability is a concern which was raised during discussions.

Marwan Bardouh requested that the City consider selling plates rather than giving the plates away which would protect the taxi drivers who have invested a lot of money to purchase plates. Mr. Bardouh noted at this time there is an opportunity to enter into a level playing field which could save taxpayers money and save the taxi industry from collapse.

Wes Cameron noted the negative elements with regard to Uber in other cities around the world and requested that civic and community ownership be retained in transportation.

Fatih Ayalp stated that standards should not be lowered in order for Transportation Network Companies to operate in Saskatoon, and that instead they operate at the same standard as the taxi industry.

The Committee recessed at 4:00 p.m., and re-convened at 4:10 p.m.

Discussion ensued regarding the Committee seeing the proposed amendments and options for the proposed Bylaws prior to the bylaws being prepared.

That the Standing Policy Committee on Transportation recommend to City Council:

1. That the Administration report on the creation of a comprehensive vehicle for hire bylaw including contents and

- options of same and a stand-alone bylaw for TNCs with consequential amendments to the Taxi Bylaw:
- 2. That the Administration be directed to report back concerning:
 - Amending The Taxi Bylaw to allow the implementation of part-time Flex Service licenses, issued to qualified drivers, to meet demand in peak periods;
 - Amending The Taxi Bylaw to allow for the replacement of seasonal licenses with full-time plates, issued to qualified drivers, reflecting the Sask Plates proposal;
 - c. Reviewing the current taxi meter fare structure and develop options to improve affordability; and
 - d. Reviewing regulations applicable to the taxi industry to support a 'level playing field' should development of regulations for transportation network companies be approved by City Council.

- 2. That the Administration provide a further report on the current levels of service to people requiring accessible service, and the potential impacts of the incorporation of ridesharing on Accessibility services.
