7.1 Delegated Authority Matters

7.1.1 Infill Lane Paving Requirements [Files CK 6315-1 and TS 6000-1]

7.2 Matters Requiring Direction

7.2.1 National Trade Corridors Fund Projects [Files CK 6000-1, x1860-1 and TS 6332-01]

A/General Manger, Transportation & Utilities Department Gardiner indicated that since the writing of the report, the Administration has taken a closer look at the phasing of the project and is recommending a reduced scope for the first intake for the Highway 11 and Highway 16 project. The scope was reduced to take advantage of the federal funding during this initial intake, but will

allow Transportation to further evaluate the phasing of the significant improvements, and will provide an opportunity to better evaluate and prioritize these improvements against the other infrastructure needs throughout the city. The first phase of the Highway 16 and 11 project has a cost estimate of \$1.5M to design and install an over height detection system and construct bypass infrastructure for over height loads.

That the City's application to the National Trade Corridors Fund for the Highway 11 and Highway 16 Interchange Upgrades be endorsed.

Growth Plan Manager Schulz introduced Mr. John Hubbell, HDR Inc., who provided a PowerPoint presentation regarding future bus rapid transit plans.

That the Standing Policy Committee on Transportation recommend to City Council that the preferred configuration and conceptual network for the Bus Rapid Transit system, as outlined in the report of the General Manager, Community Services Department dated November 6, 2017, be approved as the basis for further engagement and design.

7.2.3 Protected Bike Lane Demonstration Project – Evaluation and Next Steps [Files CK 6000-5 and TS 6330-04]

Director of Transportation Magus provided a PowerPoint presentation regarding the evaluation of the protected bike lane demonstration project and outlined next steps for the provision of the Downtown All Ages and Abilities (AAA) cycling network.

Keith Moen, Executive Director, North Saskatoon Business Association, stated that the current configuration of the bike lane on 4th Avenue restricts the main artery to the bridge, and also noted that vehicles exiting the parkade on 4th Avenue South are significantly backed up. Mr. Moen advised he had video data regarding the use of the lane on 4th Avenue which differs from the City's data.

Cathy Watt, Chair, Saskatoon Cycles, spoke in support of the downtown bike lanes as well as the development of the Downtown All Ages and Abilities cycling network.

Bob Turczyn, Saskatoon & District Safety Council, expressed concern for people with mobility issues accessing where they are going in the downtown area, due to having parking moved from the curb which creates a problem for lowering of wheelchair lifts, as well as difficulty for wheelchairs and scooters to maneuver down the bike lane onto the sidewalk.

Julie Kryzanowski, Deputy Medical Health Officer, Saskatoon Health Region, spoke in support of the bike lanes and stated that safe multi-modal transportation options increase community wellbeing and quality of life.

Randy Pshebylo, Executive Director, Riversdale Business Improvement District, spoke in support of a connected network that includes Riversdale and provided a letter to the Committee in this regard.

Moved By: Councillor Gersher

That the Standing Policy Committee on Transportation recommend to City Council:

- 1. That a provision for protected bike lanes be included in the Downtown All Ages and Abilities cycling network;
- That the Administration develop a Downtown All Ages and Abilities cycling network (including protected bike lanes) in concert with other downtown policy and planning initiatives in 2018;
- That the existing protected bike lanes on 23rd Street (from Spadina Crescent to Idylwyld Drive) and 4th Avenue (from 20th Street to 24th Street) be retained until the Downtown All Ages and Abilities cycling network is developed; and
- 4. That the report of the A/General Manager, Transportation & Utilities Department dated November 6, 2017 be forwarded to the Traffic Safety Committee for information.
