7.2 Transportation 2016 Annual Report [File No. CK 6320-37]

The Transportation 2016 Annual Report was provided for the Committee's information.

The Chair highlighted the areas relevant to the Committee:

- Installation of new active pedestrian corridors that utilize amber flashing beacons to notify motorists that a pedestrian is at the crosswalk.
- Intersection operational improvements, such as pavement marking changes, lane designation, etc.
- The Neighborhood Traffic Review program which addresses traffic concerns within residential neighbourhoods such as speeding and pedestrian safety.

8. NEW ISSUES RAISED BY COMMITTEE MEMBERS (File No. CK. 225-8)

8.1 Central Avenue Between 109th Street and 112th Street (K. Claffey)

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> Central Avenue, between 109th and 112th Streets, has many obstacles at the intersections that hide pedestrians at crosswalks and place the pedestrians in danger as drivers are unable to see them until they step into the traffic stream. Examples of obstacles are planters, garbage receptacles and poles which combine to clutter the intersections.

> The Administration advised that Central Avenue went through a streetscaping project a few years ago and the planters, etc. are a result of that project.

The Administration undertook to check into the design guidelines.
