1. Sask911 Service Agreement (File No. CK. 270-3)

that the City of Saskatoon become a provincial Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) in the Provincial 9-1-1 system; and 2) that His Worship the Mayor and the City Clerk be authorized to sign the attached Agreement. ADOPTED.

Discussions have been underway for some time between municipal and provincial officials regarding the City's participation in a Provincial 9-1-1 system.

The attached draft Agreement has been reviewed by the City Solicitor's Office with respect to legal matters, and by the General Manager of Corporate Services with respect to operational and financial matters.

The following are comments of the City Solicitor's Office:

1. The Agreement addresses the issue of indemnification/insurance which was at issue during the summer and early fall of 1998. We have had various correspondence and discussions with the Solicitor from the Department of Justice in charge of this matter. The Justice Department maintained its position that the Province would not provide a blanket indemnity to the City. Justice did agree to a

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partial indemnity, and did agree that costs of insurance, etc., could be deducted from the Sask911 funding received by the City.

- 2. All compensation the City is to receive (for past and future services) is limited to the compensation provided by means of the City's share of the line charges. Mr. Brij Mather, in a letter to Mr. Phil Richards dated June 29th, states that the Province intends to implement these line charges by September, 1999.
- 3. Council should be aware that the City has no mechanism to force an increase should the cost of providing the service change or increase or should unforseen circumstances arise. It is solely the Minister's discretion as to whether or not any increases in funding will be granted."
