BACKGROUND

The City has been using the Microsoft Office Suite of products (Word, Excel, PowerPoint etc.), desktop/laptop operating systems (Windows 98, Windows XP and Windows 7), Client Access Licenses and server components for almost twenty years.

REPORT

The Province of Saskatchewan negotiated an umbrella Enterprise Agreement with Microsoft in 2001 which allows the City to take advantage of the lowest maintenance rate offered in North America, with the exception of Health Care and Education.

Your Administration first entered into a three-year Enterprise Agreement with Microsoft in August 2003, and renewed it in August 2007. Prior to entering into the first Enterprise Agreement in 2003, upgrades were purchased when they became available. This proved to be very costly, difficult to manage and your Administration struggled to keep its desktop computing environment current. The Enterprise Agreement (Attachment No. 1) covers 1,206 desktop/laptop computers for the City and 363 desktop/laptop computers for the Saskatoon Police Services and a selection of server components. The annual cost per desktop is \$313.25 per year.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are adequate funds approved in the 2010 Operating Budget to cover the cost of the first instalment of the Enterprise Agreement, which runs from September 1, 2010, through August 31, 2011. Adequate funds have been allocated in the proposed 2011 and 2012 Operating Budgets. Attachment No. 2 shows the detailed three-year maintenance plan costs. Please note that, in the legal survey documents received, this walkway has been identified as a lane. This lane has not been used by any vehicle traffic, and has only been used by pedestrian as walkway.

Approved Capital Project 0625 – Trunk Sewer – Northwest Sector included the construction of the University Heights Storm Pond, which commenced in 2009. Pond construction involves the relocation of large amounts of excavated material. Construction of the Evergreen neighbourhood also commenced in 2009. Due to their close proximity, it was possible to use a considerable amount of the material excavated from the storm pond site for area grading in the Evergreen neighbourhood, which resulted in a cost savings of \$800,000 in Capital Project 0625.

Capital Project 0625, originally fully funded by prepaid levies, received funding from the Municipal Economic Enhancement Program (MEEP) in the amount of \$2,970,000, which allowed the same amount to be placed into the Trunk Sewer Reserve.

One of the requirements of the MEEP program is that any funds remaining from the approved project must be used by the municipality for a similar type of project. Capital Project -0634 – Trunk Sewer - North Industrial includes the construction of the University Heights Storm Pond. Therefore, the Administration is recommending that the \$800,000 surplus be transferred from Capital Project 0625 to Capital Project 0634, and that this amount be transferred from Capital Project 0634 to the Trunk Sewer Reserve.

Request for Sole Source - Award of Construction Engineering Services Capital Project 778 - Stonebridge Sanitary and Storm Water Lift Station File No. CK. 7820-3 and IS. 4111-32

Approved Capital Project 778 – Stonebridge Sanitary and Storm Water Lift Station includes funding in the amount of \$4,070,000 for construction of the lift station. In March 2007, the engineering consulting firm of UMA, now AECOM Canada, was selected to carry out the design of the sanitary and storm sewer lift station. That work has now been completed.

Since the scope of construction services is not easily defined prior to design, a sole source fee proposal for engineering services for construction was requested from AECOM Canada Ltd., after the design services for the lift station was completed and the scope of the project could be determined. The proposal from AECOM Canada Ltd. was priced on a time and expense basis, at a total estimated cost of \$112,110, plus G.S.T. This quote is in line with the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of Saskatchewan (APEGS).

Timely completion of this project will allow construction of the lift station to be completed within the deadline date of December 31, 2010

ADOPTED.

According to City of Saskatoon Policy C09-008 (Naming of Civic Property and Development Areas), all requests for adding names to the Names Master List must be screened by the Naming Advisory Committee (Committee) and approved by City Council.

The Committee has reviewed and screened the following names in accordance with City Council's naming guidelines and recommends to City Council that they be added to the Names Master List:

a) General Naming Request:

i. "Richards" – John Howard and Mary Helen Richards – Mr. Richards was born in Caerphilly, Wales. He completed an undergraduate degree in Wales. Mr. Richards completed his Masters and Doctoral degrees at the University of Toronto. Mr. Richards founded the University of Saskatchewan's Geography Department and was its first Department Head

and Professor Emeritus. Throughout his career, Mr. Richards wrote numerous articles about Saskatchewan including entries in the World Book and was co-author and editor of the <u>Atlas of Saskatchewan</u> in 1969. Mr. Richards was a World War II veteran serving under the Canadian Armed Forces.

Ms. Mary Helen Richards was born in Somerville, Massachusetts. Ms. Richards completed her Masters Degrees in Nursing and Home Economics. Active in education, women's rights, children's rights (Parents Anonymous and founding member of the Crisis Nursery, Theatre for Children), and elderly rights (Council for the Aged). Ms. Richards received numerous awards in recognition of her efforts including Saskatoon's Citizen of the Year in 1978.

ii. "Aronec" – George Aronec – Mr. Aronec served in World War II, and was stationed in Holland and Germany.

Mr. Aronec moved to Saskatoon in 1969 to work in the real estate market. In 1970, Mr. Aronec began a home construction business, Nu-Central Homes. Mr. Aronec was one of the first builders to build pre-fabricated, affordable homes in Saskatoon. In 1980, Mr. Aronec took on a partner, resulting in the company's name changing to Nu-Fab Building Products.

iii. "Yevshan" – Yevshan Ukrainian Folk Ballet of Saskatoon – The Yevshan Ukrainian Folk Ballet of Saskatoon (Yevshan) is the oldest Ukrainian Folk Ballet in Saskatchewan, celebrating their 50th anniversary in November, 2010.

Yevshan has performed in a number of events in numerous countries including England, Sweden, Ukraine, Cuba, and the United States of America. They have also performed for the Governor General and Her Majesty Queen Elisabeth II.

b) Specific Naming Request:

i. "Hyde" – The Leisure Services Branch has submitted a request to name the Hyde Stormwater Management Area and the adjacent Municipal Reserve (MR) parcel 'Hyde Park'. As described below, the Hyde Stormwater Management Area and the adjacent MR parcel are being developed in an integrated way. The proposal to name the entire space 'Hyde Park' is meant to be clearer for those using the park.

The proposed Hyde Park is located in the South East Park, which comprises 86.5 hectares. Taylor Street divides the South East Park into north and south sites, with the proposed Hyde Park located south of Taylor Street.

The South East Park incorporates several distinct but integrated functions. A series of four ponds acts as a stormwater collection area for the adjacent neighbourhoods (that is, Briarwood, Rosewood, Lakewood Suburban Centre, Lakeridge, and possible future residential developments to the east). MR land is incorporated at three locations. The Hyde Stormwater Management Area, which was named by City Council in 2003, consists of three of the ponds.

In an effort to integrate the entire South East Park, a master plan was completed to develop the site as a seamless greenspace. The master plan proposes active and passive recreation and educational opportunities to optimize the potential for the entire site. All passive recreation areas and pond edges are proposed as naturalized areas, using predominantly native plant species and incorporating stands of tall dryland or native grasses.

The Names Master List is kept in the City of Saskatoon Mayor's Office and contains all screened and approved name suggestions for naming municipally owned or controlled facilities, streets, suburban development areas, neighbourhoods, and parks. There are currently approximately 190 entries on the Names Master List. The Planning and Development Branch will notify the applicants of the outcome of City Council's decision.

However the Policy does not address the situation of a member of Council being drawn into legal nuisance actions or lawsuits which are not *bona fide*, merely because of their position in public office.

It is recommended that the Indemnification Policy be amended by adding the following section:

"Frivolous or Vexatious Matters

Notwithstanding the forgoing, where, in the opinion of the City Solicitor, a civil action, proceeding or matter against or in relation to a member or, without limiting the generality of the forgoing, a subpoena issued to a member, is not *bona fide*, is frivolous, vexatious or otherwise abusive, and there is no conflict between the positions of the member and the City, the City Solicitor, with the consent of the member, may represent the member in the matter at the expense of the City."
