Winter Cycling Celebration on February 7

A group of winter cycling enthusiasts has announced a new event in Saskatoon called *Ice Cycle* on Sunday, February 7. This celebration of winter bike riding for all ages involves a workshop on winter riding, a bike parade through the downtown area (on cleared, sanded streets without competing traffic), bike repair support, and an opportunity to donate winter clothing to the Open Door Society. The event is also a fundraiser to construct new bike racks for Saskatoon, administered by We Are Many (WAM).

33rd Street Multi-Use Corridor Project Launched

The City of Saskatoon is embarking on the development of a multi-use corridor along 33rd Street that connects the University of Saskatchewan, SIAST Kelsey Campus and adjoining neighbourhoods. Crosby Hanna & Associates has been awarded the planning and design contract for this project which will include public input into the corridor design. This project is intended to significantly improve the safety and comfort of cyclists and pedestrians accessing the University of Saskatchewan and SIAST Kelsey Campus.

This project will be constructed over a number of years with construction proposed to begin in 2010.

The 33rd Street Multi-Use Corridor Project is funded through the Provincial-Territorial Base Funding Agreement between the Government of Canada, Government of Saskatchewan and the City of Saskatoon.
