

# City of Saskatoon Accessible Parking Permit

- The accessible parking permit must be attached to a current and valid SaskAbilities parking placard. The placard must be hung from the inside rear-view mirror and be visible from the outside of the vehicle.
- I have an accessible parking permit. Where can I park?
  - The permit allows users to park **for free on the street in pay parking zones** for up to four (4) hours. This includes all on-street parking stalls, disabled parking zones, and loading zones.
  - Designated **disabled persons loading zones** may only be parked in for the time indicated on the sign:



On-street parking stalls only. Up to 4 hours.

For time indicated on sign.

- Vehicles parked in the same stall for longer than time allows will be in violation and subject to enforcement measures.
- The permit is NOT valid in the following locations:
  - Public or private parking lots
  - Private property
  - Bus stops
  - University, Airport, Hospital, and other private parking lots
  - No Parking or No Stopping areas
- When do permits expire?
  - City of Saskatoon accessible permits expire every year at the end of October. Permits for the new permit year are available at the beginning of October.
  - An expired SaskAbilities placard or accessible parking permit will result in the vehicle being ticketed.
  - Replacement accessible parking permits will be provided free of charge.
