Be in the Know About Snow

From snow grading to sanding, the City has crews working around the clock to keep Saskatoon moving after it snows.





Winter Road Maintenance

When it snows, salting, sanding and plowing occurs on high traffic roads and priority streets, starting with Circle Drive and freeways, followed by neighbourhoods.



City Sidewalks and Paths

Meewasin Trail, lit park pathways and walkways along freeways, arterials, bridges and overpasses are cleared within 48 hours after a snowfall.



School Zones

School loading zones are graded and snow is pushed into snow piles. The piles are removed as they approach 60 cm.



Snow Removal

Snow is stored along priority streets and will be removed to make room for more snowfall.



Sidewalk Clearing

Thank you for clearing your sidewalks within 48 hours after a snowfall. Please keep the snow on your property.



Winter Road Safety

Blue and amber lights flashing means snow maintenance equipment is working ahead. Please slow down, remain at least 15 metres (2.5 car lengths) behind, and be prepared to stop.



Transit Winter Services

When it snows, Saskatoon Transit adjusts its service based on the amount of snow that falls, ranging from service running late to service cancellations. Visit **saskatoontransit.ca**, Google Transit or the Transit App for timely updates.
