Who collects our recycling?

Why is it important to recycle?

- Businesses and organizations generate 68% of all of Saskatoon's garbage. 169,000 tonnes of waste go to Saskatoon and area landfills each year.
- 24% of garbage accepted by the City's landfill in 2016 was from businesses and organizations. The remaining 145,100 tonnes of garbage generated by businesses and organizations were sent to privately operated landfills.
- Most of the material collected from these businesses and organizations is not garbage at all! Much of what is thrown out is paper, cardboard and food that can easily be diverted from landfill.
- A successful recycling program not only demonstrates your organization's commitment to sustainability and our community, but can also help your bottom line, conserve natural resources, and save valuable space in our landfills.
- Waste diversion programs are good for business as they will retain or attract new customers and employees with the same values and illustrate a business's commitment to making Saskatoon a beautiful place to live, work, learn and play.
