UPCOMING WORK MAY AFFECT WATER PRESSURE IN YOUR NEIGHBOURHOOD

**Acadia Drive Water Reservoir and Pump House Upgrade
October 19, 2015 - March 21, 2016**

Saskatoon Water is preparing to meet the water supply needs of the City with upgrades to the Acadia Drive Water Reservoir and Pump House. This facility serves all Saskatoon Water customers located south of College Drive and east of Preston Avenue.

A map on the reverse side of this flyer shows affected neighbourhoods.

Will I still have water?

Yes, Saskatoon Water customers will continue to have high quality drinking water during this construction project, although the pressure may be lower at certain times.

How will households be affected?

You may notice lower water pressure at your tap in the morning and early evening, when water demand periods are higher. Over the next 5 months, water pressure may be as low as 40-50 pounds per square inch (psi) for short periods, compared to the normal supply of 55-60 psi.

What should I do to prepare?

Standard household plumbing systems are designed to operate at a minimum of 40 psi. If you have a system that requires more pressure to operate, such as a luxury spa, or multi-story building, you are encouraged to confirm that there are no restrictions, and that booster pumps are functioning properly, where required.
