## LIMITED OR CLOSED COMPETITIONS & DIRECT AWARDS

The City of Saskatoon's Indigenous procurement set-asides are based off the following principles:

- ➤ Best value procurement and building capacity for Indigenous businesses and communities
- Number of Indigenous Business within a market segment
- > Work is completed on Indigenous lands
- Opportunity predominantly benefits and supports the Indigenous Community
