# Neighbourhood Traffic Review Process

- **2013** – New process
  - **Mandate** – Reduce and calm traffic, improve safety within neighbourhoods
- **2014** – 11 neighbourhoods
- **2015 / 2016** – 8 neighbourhoods
- **2017** – Buena Vista, Queen Elizabeth / Exhibition, Pleasant Hill, Wildwood, Silverwood Heights, Richmond Heights / North Park, Erindale / Arbor Creek, Dundonald



# Buena Vista Review Schedule

- **Stage 1** – Identify issues and possible solutions through community consultation (June to Fall 2017/Early 2018)
- **Stage 2** – Develop a draft traffic plan
- **Stage 3** – Present draft traffic plan to community for feedback (Fall 2017/Early 2018)
- **Stage 4** – Implement changes over time (Beginning Spring 2018)

- Broadway Ave – better pedestrian crossings needed
- Broadway Ave & Taylor St – advanced green left turn signal needed
- Broadway Ave & 8<sup>th</sup> St – get rid of pedestrian buttons
- 8<sup>th</sup> St & Eastlake Ave – pedestrian-activated light needed

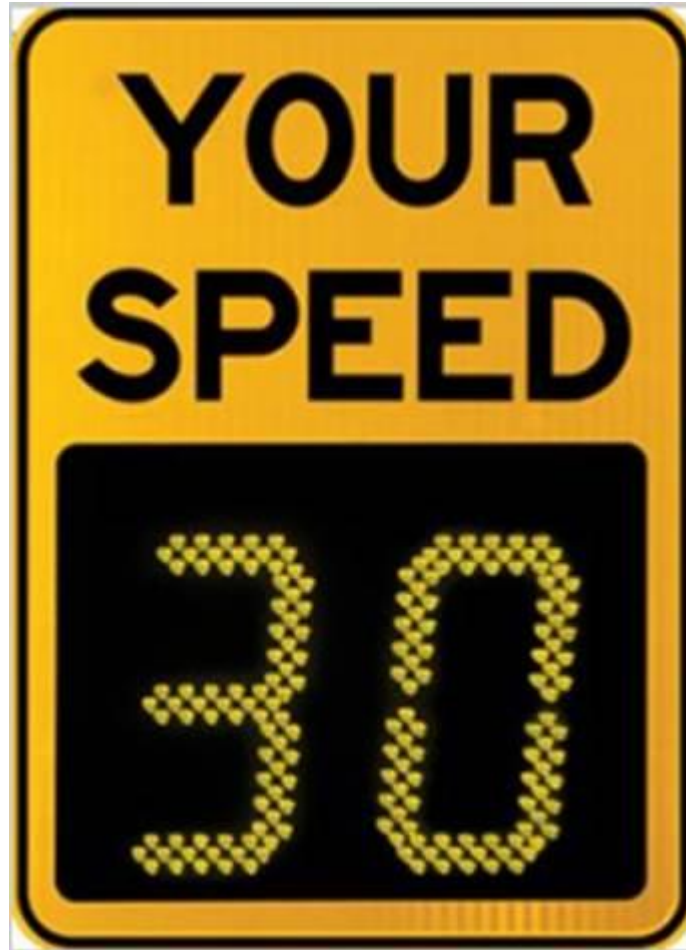
# Corridor Reviews & Major Intersection Reviews

- Created to address issues at intersections along arterial streets as Neighbourhood Traffic Reviews addresses local and collector streets
- Recommendations will be identified and projects will be prioritized for funding approval
- Report will be presented to City Council

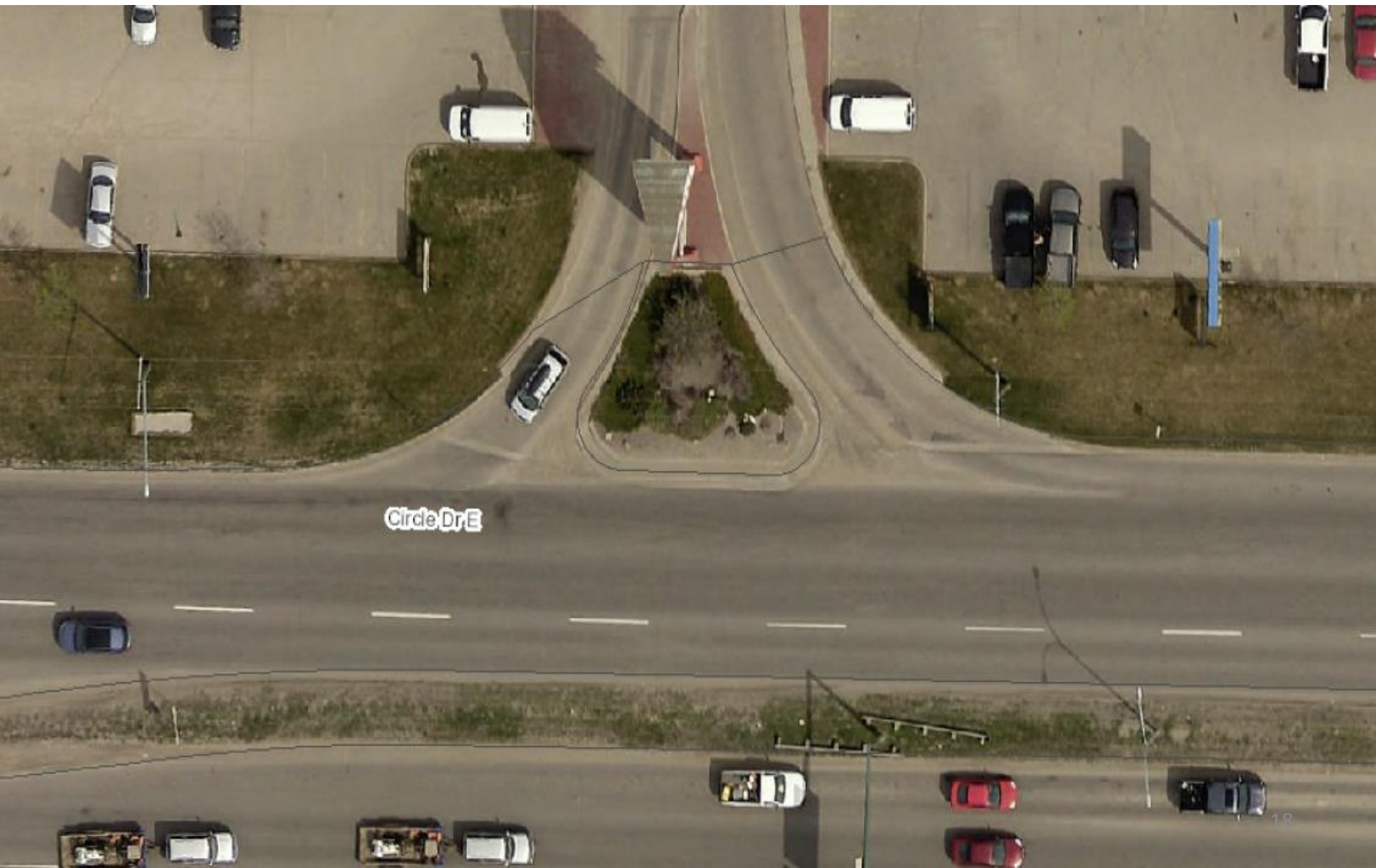
