ENVIRONMENTAL GRANT PROGRAM

Deadline: February 6, 2026

The Environmental Cash Grant Program provides matching funding up to \$10,000 to nonprofit organizations for environmental projects that contribute to a more environmentally sustainable Saskatoon.

What kind of projects are eligible?

- Protecting and enhancing Saskatoon’s Green Network and natural resources: This includes natural areas, wetlands, parks, gardens, trees, and urban agriculture
- Safeguarding our water: Projects that protect and conserve Saskatoon’s water resources
- Improving energy and water efficiency: Upgrades to buildings or operations that reduce energy use and water consumption
- Reducing landfill waste: Initiatives that cut down on garbage and promote reuse, recycling, or composting.
- Encouraging active transportation: Supporting walking, biking, and other eco-friendly ways to get around.
- Promoting environmental awareness: Education, research, and communication efforts that help advance the City’s environmental goals

Carbon monoxide (CO) is an odourless, colourless, tasteless, deadly gas. Elevated levels of carbon monoxide can cause illness or death before people even know it is there.

A carbon monoxide alarm will alert you if dangerous levels of carbon monoxide are accumulating. Carbon monoxide alarms should be installed outside each sleeping area and are most effective when interconnected throughout your home.
