PLAN AHEAD FOR SASKATOON TRANSIT BROADWAY BRIDGE DETOURS

Several Saskatoon Transit routes are now being detoured due to the closure of the Broadway Bridge for scheduled rehabilitation.

Bus stops on Broadway Avenue, between 12th and 8th streets, are temporarily relocated to Victoria Avenue with new short-term signage. Two downtown stops on 19th Street near the Broadway Bridge are also closed. Check the directional signage at closed bus stops for your nearest eastbound or westbound travel stop.

Saskatoon Transit routes to and from downtown use Victoria Avenue and the Traffic Bridge.

- Westbound Service: Routes 8 and the Oskāyak High School Route.
- Eastbound Service: Routes 81, 82, 84, 86.
