

On November 8 and 9, 2016, I spoke to the sentencing of Harley Irwin who had entered guilty pleas to 19 counts of voyeurism and I am writing to advise of the excellent investigation led by Detective Cst. Michelle Kinzel (#495).

In November of 2014, Harley Irwin was seen taping a woman while she was undressed at a tanning salon in Saskatoon. The responding officers took statements from all involved and the investigation was turned over to Det/Cst. Kinzel. Det/Cst. Kinzel obtained a search warrant and with a number of other officers from the SPS searched the residence of Mr. Irwin and seized cell phones from Mr. Irwin, amongst other items. A black iphone contained movideos of which were concerning as they appeared to be of women who were undressed and unaware that they were being videoed.

Sgt. Grant McMillian (#463) completed the analysis of the phone and was able to determine the GPS location of where a number of these videos were taken along with the date and time. A production order was obtained in order to access the client information of the tanning salons to try and identify who the female in the video was. Officers then began the arduous task of cross referencing the client records with the SGI database to locate these females. Out of the videos, they were successfully able to identify 18 of them which led to the 18 additional charges of voyeurism against Mr. Irwin. As a result of the high calibre investigation and the overwhelming evidence gathered by the officers of the Saskatoon Police Service, Mr. Irwin entered a guilty plea at the docket stage to 19 counts of voyeurism and 3 weapons related offences.

A number of other officers have been involved in this investigation and I would be remiss if I did not mention them as well. Cst. Mohinger (751) attended the original call at Fabutan in

November of 2014. Cst. Donison (605), Cst. Ternes (613), Cst. Harris (622), Cst. Ward (795), Cst. Munday (865) and Cst. McLane (716) all assisted Det/Cst. Kinzel in the execution of the search warrant. Cst. Akin (616) assisted in reviewing the videos. My apologies if I have neglected to mention any other officers involved in this investigation.

In preparing for the sentencing hearing, I spoke with Det/Cst. Kinzel a number of times and each time I was impressed with her professionalism and dedication especially as it related to this file. She responded quickly to any questions I had and was able to review the file with me to ensure I had a thorough understanding of the intricacies of this file prior to speaking to sentence. I advised her that I was going to require her at Court with exhibits for the sentencing and she quickly arranged the exhibits for me and prepared to testify on two separate occasions. I cannot speak highly enough of the investigation that took place on this file led by Det/Cst. Kinzel.

As a direct result of the quality and thoroughness of this investigation, there was an early guilty plea and Mr. Irwin and his surreptitious activities came to light before any more women could be victimized by Mr. Irwin.

- -Unauthorized Possession of Firearm in Motor Vehicle
- -Possession of Prohibited Firearm with Ammunition
- -Breach of Probation
