
I received a voice mail from Ruth [REDACTED] this morning who lives at [REDACTED] on Thursday, June 1st.

Subject: Airplane flying around at 2am?

I'm not sure who to email this to. It is not a complaint against misconduct nor a report of wrong doing. Only a noisy airplane that was flying around at 2am keeping me awake for an hour. I would rather not go to social media or John Gormley if I can get an acceptable response from the Police Service first.

Early this morning May 31 between 2am-3am I could hear a propeller airplane flying above. The decibel noise pollution I will grant was low, but in a quiet new neighborhood like Willowgrove I found it a nuisance and unnecessary noise pollution at a time of day that should be quiet time. I am a light sleeper, but because of the buzzing frequency of the propeller noise, even with my earplugs in I could hear it flying around for an hour. Proper night time sleep is essential for me to work my 40 hours a week and raise my 4 children (with my wife) who are in school, activities, and day care. Fortunately I have not had to resort to medication/sleeping pills since we are in a quiet neighborhood, and sedatives would also not be safe with children in the house.

My question is two-fold. Who is allowed to fly a plane at that time of night waking up (I am sure) more citizens than just myself? And secondly, if it is a Police Service aircraft, was this an important operation or just a standard patrolling shift? I can accept a one-off operation that may involve heat-vision reconnaissance or something the like, but I would be a little frustrated if my tax dollars are putting a plane in the air just to keep me awake at night. I am sure there is a good explanation for this and I look forward to a reply:

Laura [REDACTED] called this morning to express her appreciation for S/Cst. Shelly Takahashi #8727 and Cst. Mikhaila Bird #875.

Ms. [REDACTED] came to the Service Centre yesterday to report a sexual assault involving her sister who is a resident at a long term care home. Ms. [REDACTED] mentioned that no one in her family has ever dealt with something like this before nor did they ever expect that they would have to.

She said that S/Cst. Takahashi was very methodical in the process of receiving her report, carefully thinking of who to call and what to do. Ms. [REDACTED] noted the importance of this skill for the first person dealing with her concerns.

Next, Ms. [REDACTED] met with Cst. Mikhaila Bird at the care home. Ms. [REDACTED] advised that she works in long term care herself and she was very impressed that Cst. Bird said hello and was gracious to all residents she encountered, noting that this is not common practice for people she sees in the care homes in general and that this made the residents feel more at ease as they are not used to seeing police in the facility. Cst. Bird's style and approach was amazing and very much appreciated by Ms. [REDACTED] in this situation that was very upsetting not only for her sister, the victim, but for their family.



PROJECT LIFESAVER

This morning we were proud to be part of a news conference that announced a fundraising initiative for equipment that may help to save lives.

For many years, [Saskatoon Search and Rescue](#) has utilized volunteers to provide search and rescue efforts and assistance to organizations such as the SPS, Saskatoon EMO and the RCMP. In 2016, SSAR volunteers were called out on 17 occasions and in four instances so far in 2017. Many of the SSAR activation's are searches for people who are in a vulnerable state including older adults with dementia or health concerns.

Project Lifesaver is a program that uses bracelets with individualized radio frequency to help locate at-risk persons. While the funds are needed to be raised before the program is put into practice, families will be able to register information ahead of time and receive a bracelet that can be activated in emergencies.

Funding for Project Lifesaver will be provided to the SSAR as part of the inaugural fundraising initiative conducted by the Saskatoon Police Service Foundation.
