P4G - SASKATOON NORTH PARTNERSHIP FOR GROWTH DISTRICT PLANNING COMMISSION

The Saskatoon North Partnership for Growth (P4G) District Planning Commission is scheduled to be established in January 2022. It will consist of representatives of the Rural Municipality of Corman Park, the City of Martensville, the Town of Osler, the City of Saskatoon, and the City of Warman (the "Affiliated Municipalities"), who will make recommendations on land use planning in the P4G Planning District, which is a jointly managed area of the Rural Municipality of Corman Park that surrounds each of the Affiliated Municipalities.

The District Planning Commission membership consists of 13 members: two members appointed by each of the Councils of the Affiliated Municipalities, at least one of whom must be an elected Council member, and three members appointed jointly by the Councils of the Affiliated Municipalities.

Members will be appointed for three-year terms, commencing January 1 and concluding December 31. Non-Council members are eligible to be re-appointed a maximum of three, three-year terms.

Regular District Planning Commission meetings are scheduled once per month, generally on the first Wednesday of each month at 11:45 a.m. with lunch provided, followed by an in-camera meeting in the afternoon if needed. Remuneration for municipal representatives will be determined by each Affiliated Municipality in accordance with their own policies. The Affiliated Municipalities will collectively determine the remuneration for the jointly appointed representatives.

To be eligible as an appointed representative for Saskatoon, the representative must live in Saskatoon.

Consideration for the jointly appointed representatives of the Affiliated Municipalities includes the following:

- residence of the applicant – must reside in or own land within the boundaries of one of the five Affiliated Municipalities;
- expressed interest and demonstrated understanding of the subject matter;
- current and past involvement on boards, commissions, special interest groups or organizations consisting of similar or related subject matter;
- ability to commit time to prepare for and attend meetings;
- preference will be given to applicants who do not currently represent a special interest group; and
- applicants must not be practicing realtors or land developers, or actively engage in a related profession (e.g. planning consultant, civil engineering consultant, land surveyor).

Applicants who are interested in representing Saskatoon or being a jointly appointed representative of the Affiliated Municipalities, are asked to submit their application and resumé with two letters of reference by **no later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday, October 4, 2021**, using the Committee Application Form found online at saskatoon.ca/boards. All applications will be kept on file and reviewed throughout the year should further vacancies occur.
