Saskatoon Municipal Wards Commission – June 19, 2019

The Saskatoon Municipal Wards Commission is seeking insight and information from citizens of Saskatoon as the Commission looks to establish new ward boundaries for the municipal/school boards' elections on November 9, 2020.

Interested citizens are invited to review current ward boundaries and projected growth areas, and present their thoughts at the first of two public consultations:

PUBLIC NOTICE

INTENT TO BORROW

City Council will be considering a report from the Administration at a Council meeting to be held on Monday, June 24th, 2019 at 6:00 p.m., Council Chambers, City Hall recommending:

- 1) That the following planned borrowing in the form of an internal line of credit be approved:
 - a) up to \$20 million for Civic Facilities Energy and Water Monitoring (Capital Project 2568) from the General Account long-term investment portfolio, amortized over a 25 year period;
 - b) an allowable 10% variance on the borrowing requirements for the project identified. Any variance greater than 10% of the borrowing amount identified must be reported to City Council; and
- 2) That a one-time exemption be approved to allow for an investment with a maturity term exceeding 10 years.

The Cities Act and The Public Notice Policy Bylaw No. 8171 require that City Council give public

notice before borrowing money, lending money or guaranteeing the repayment of a loan.
