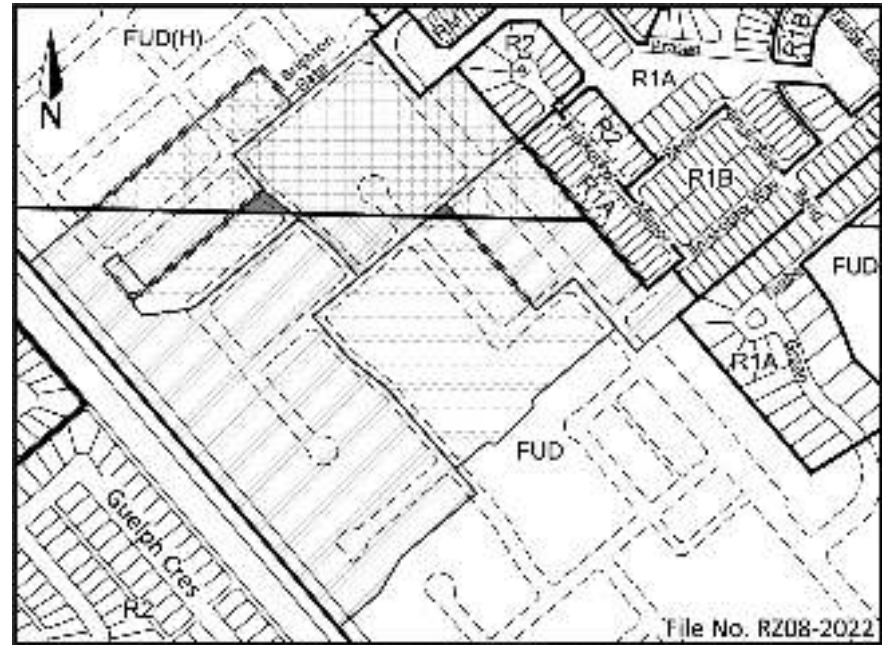

PROPOSED ZONING BYLAW AMENDMENT – BYLAW NO. 9839 THE ZONING AMENDMENT BYLAW, 2022 (NO. 17)

Saskatoon City Council will consider an amendment to the City's Zoning Bylaw (No. 8770) proposed by Dream Development to rezone land in the Brighton neighbourhood. By way of Bylaw No. 9839, The Zoning Amendment Bylaw, 2022 (No. 17), the subject area adjacent to Brighton Gate is proposed to be rezoned from FUD - Future Urban Development District, a portion of which is subject to the Holding Symbol (H) to R1A - One Unit Residential District, R1B – Small Lot One-Unit Residential District, and R2 – One and Two-Unit Residential District.

Carbon monoxide (CO) is an odourless, colourless, tasteless, deadly gas. Elevated levels of carbon monoxide can cause illness or death before people even know it is there.
