

ZONING NOTICE

519 2nd Avenue North (Great Western Brewing Company) PROPOSED ZONING BYLAW AMENDMENT – BYLAW NO. 9814 THE ZONING AMENDMENT BYLAW, 2022 (NO. 7)

Saskatoon City Council will consider an amendment to the City's Zoning Bylaw (No. 8770) proposed by Great Western Brewing Company to rezone 519 2nd Avenue North (the location of Great Western's current operations), located in the City Park neighbourhood. By way of Bylaw No. 9814, The Zoning Amendment Bylaw, 2022 (No. 7), the subject site is proposed to be rezoned from IL1 – General Light Industrial District to IH – Heavy Industrial District subject to a Zoning Agreement.

LEGAL DESCRIPTION – Lots 32 and 33, Block 186, Plan No. 99SA24455



REASON FOR THE AMENDMENT – The proposed rezoning will provide for the development of a new brewing facility located on the southeast corner of the property that will be integrated with the existing building that fronts 2nd Avenue North. Approximately 690 m² of leasable commercial space is proposed as an adaptive re-use of a portion of the existing building that will be vacated by the brewery.

A Zoning Agreement will limit permitted uses of the land to a brewery and its associated activities, as well as a limited range of commercial uses within the leasable commercial space. All other industrial uses, as well as the production of excessive nuisances, will be prohibited.
