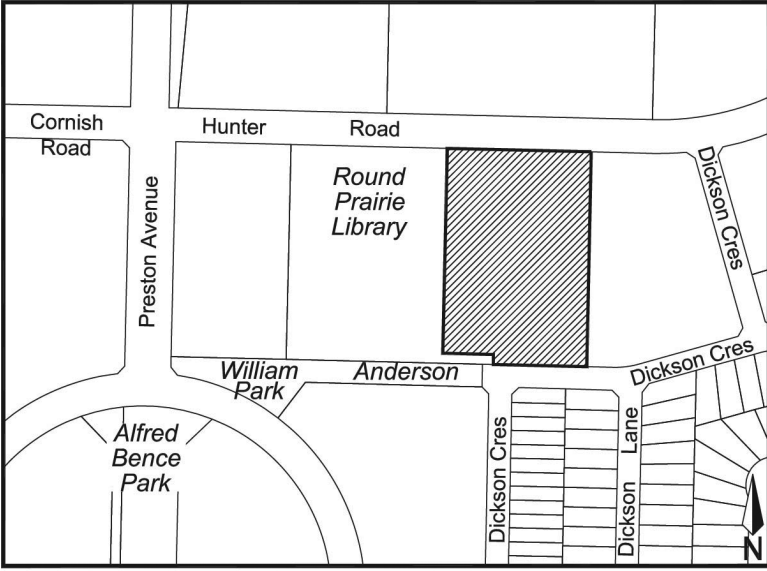
STONEBRIDGE NEIGHBOURHOOD CONCEPT PLAN – PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Saskatoon City Council will consider an amendment to the Stonebridge Neighbourhood Concept Plan proposed by Meridian Development Corp. The proposed amendments would amend the land use for the eastern portion of 250 Hunter Road from Mixed Use 2 – High Density to Medium Density Residential (65 units/ha±).

REASON FOR THE AMENDMENT – The proposed Stonebridge Neighbourhood Concept Plan amendment, in conjunction with a Zoning Bylaw amendment, would provide for the future subdivision and development of the subject parcel in accordance with the development standards of the RM4 – Medium/High Density Multiple-Unit Dwelling District.

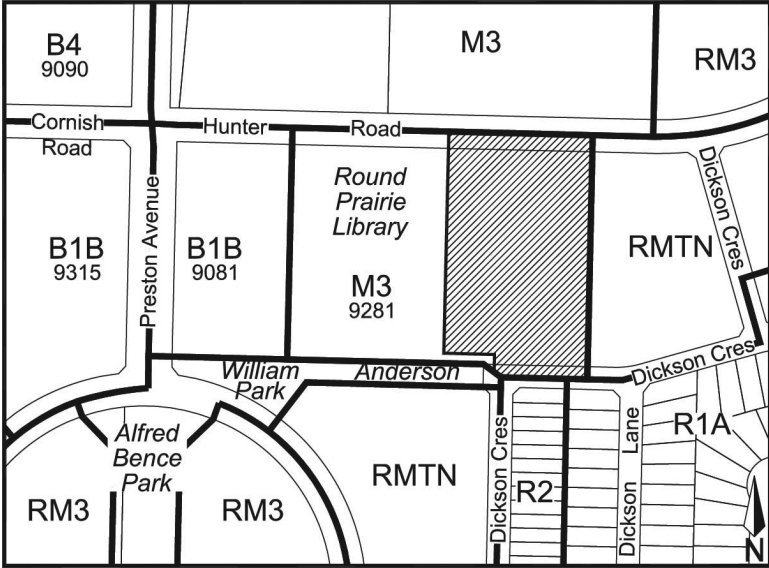

Saskatoon City Council will further consider the amendment to the City’s Zoning Bylaw (No. 8770) proposed by Meridian Development Corp. to rezone the eastern portion of 250 Hunter Road, located in the Stonebridge Neighbourhood. By way of Bylaw No. 9841, The Zoning Amendment Bylaw, 2022 (No. 18), the eastern portion of 250 Hunter Road is proposed to be rezoned from M3 - General Institutional Service District by Zoning Agreement to RM4 - Medium/High Density Multiple-Unit Dwelling District.

CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS SAVE LIVES

Carbon monoxide (CO) is an odourless, colourless, tasteless, deadly gas. Elevated levels of carbon monoxide can cause illness or death before people even know it is there.

A carbon monoxide alarm will alert you if dangerous levels of carbon monoxide are accumulating. Carbon monoxide alarms should be installed outside each sleeping area and are most effective when interconnected throughout your home.

If your carbon monoxide alarm sounds or you suspect carbon monoxide in your home, immediately move to a location with fresh air and call 9-1-1.

Wandering Cats love KITTEN Around

If you want to provide your cat with the stimulating experience of the outdoors, consider teaching your cat to walk with a harness and leash or invest in a Catio (cat patio). There are many ways to ensure that your cat can safely enjoy the outdoors.

Remember, when a cat is off private property, they must be on a leash (no more than 2 metres in length) and under proper control or in a kennel. Visit saskatoon.ca/communitycats to learn more.

NEEDLES & SHARPS

If you find a needle, follow these steps:

1. Do not recap the needle.
2. Wear garden, work or medical gloves.
3. Use tweezers, pliers or tongs to pick up the needle by the end that is not the sharp end. Keep away from your body.
4. Place the needle, sharp end first, into a hard container that needles cannot poke through (e.g. liquid laundry detergent or bleach container).
5. Fill a container no more than 3/4 full. If a container is too full, the needles may poke through the side.
6. Put the container lid on tightly and tape it.
7. Wash your hands with soap and water.
8. Store the container in a safe place away from children until you can dispose of it safely.
9. Do not place needles in city garbage or recycling.
10. Place in a needle drop box in your community.
