Notice is hereby given that the Council of The City of Saskatoon intends to pass a Bylaw, pursuant to the provisions of The Heritage Property Act, S.S. 1979-80, Chapter H-2.2 as amended, to designate as Municipal Heritage Property the following real property, namely:

Surface Parcel Nos: 136183495, 136183507, 136183518 and 136183484

Legal Land Description: Blk/Par 31 Plan No G2390 Extension 0 As described on Certificate of Title 87S47369;

1. The designation shall be limited to the exterior, original structure of the building and the original north façade visible from the interior.

The reasons for the proposed designation are as follows:

1. Its Chicago style of architecture with its brick façade, the separation of the base, middle and top columns through the use of materials and ornamental detail and its flat roof;


2. Its Art Deco influences evident in its ornamental cornice and sculpted detail around its Palladian windows; and

3. Its original features such as the 'Tees and Persse Limited' inscription at the top its front façade, the painted wall signs on the building's south façade, the painted wall signs on the north façade located on the ground and sixth floors now in the interior of the addition on the north side of the building, and its location near the rail yards.

And take notice that the said Bylaw will be considered at a meeting of the Council to be held on Monday, the 25th day of January, 2023 at 6:00 p.m., in the Council Chambers at City Hall, Saskatoon, Saskatchewan.

Any person wishing to object to the proposed designation must serve on the Council a Notice of Objection, in writing, stating the reason for the objection and all relevant facts, delivering the same to and leaving the same with the City Clerk at City Hall, Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, on or before the 23rd day of January, 2023.

IS YOUR DOG READY FOR THE DOG PARK?

Dog Parks can be a great place to get exercise and socialize. Although, not all dogs and owners are quite ready for the off-leash experience.

Before going to a Dog Park ensure your dog is well behaved around pets and people. Your dog should know and obey basic commands of come, sit and stay before visiting a Dog Park. Consider taking obedience classes or hiring a qualified dog trainer.

NEEDLES & SHARPS

If you find a needle, follow these steps:

- Do not recap the needle.
- Wear garden, work or medical gloves. 2.
- 3. Use tweezers, pliers or tongs to pick up the needle by the end that is not the sharp end. Keep away from your body. 4
- Place the needle, sharp end first, into a hard container that needles cannot poke through (e.g. liquid laundry detergent or bleach container).
- Fill a container no more than 3/4 full. If a container is too full, the needles may poke through theside.
- 6. Put the container lid on tightly and tape it.
- 7. Wash your hands with soap and water.
- 8. Store the container in a safe place away from children until you can dispose of it safely.
- Do not place needles in city garbage or recycling. 9. 10. Place in a needle drop box in your community.
