

**Voter Eligibility for Saskatoon Municipal Elections:**

You can vote in City of Saskatoon municipal elections if, on the day of the election, you are:

- A Canadian citizen;
- At least 18 years old;
- A resident of Saskatoon for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election; and
- A resident of Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election.

Your residence is the place where you normally live. If you are temporarily absent from the place where you normally live, you still qualify as a resident of that place for the purposes of the election. If you have more than one home in Saskatchewan, you must choose one as your residence.

If you don't live in Saskatoon but have owned assessable land in the city for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election, you can vote for the Mayor and Ward Councillor. You are not eligible to vote for the school boards unless you live in the city. You can only vote ONCE in a municipal election in Saskatoon, regardless of how many properties you own.

To vote for candidates for the separate school board, you must be of the religious faith of the minority that established the school division, which means you must be of the Roman Catholic faith. If you are of the Ukrainian or Chaldean Catholic rites, or your faith recognizes the Pope as the leader of your church, you are considered a member of the minority Catholic faith, thereby becoming an elector for the Roman Catholic separate school board.

As there is no voters list, you will have to provide appropriate identification at the polling station before you can vote in order to prove your identity and residency. There is a list of approved identification elsewhere on this website.
