7. QUESTION PERIOD

7.1 Councillor A. Iwanchuk - Ticketing and Towing During Street Sweeping

Councillor Iwanchuk asked about process for ticketing and towing during street sweeping, indicating that she has had concerns expressed to her that vehicles were ticketed and towed when street sweeper contractors were not present.

General Manager, Transportation and Utilities Jorgenson explained the process and indicated that he would address this with Public Works to identify if the process can be tightened up. He noted that any tickets would not be cancelled if they were not issued in error.

7.2 Councillor P. Lorje - CN Train Rerouting

Councillor Lorje noted that CN has rerouted more trains through the City to facilitate its track reconstruction and this is causing blockages at 11th Street and Fairlight intersections. She asked what the plans are for emergency vehicle access into the community.

General Manager, Transportation and Utilities Jorgenson indicated that CN had provided notice to the City and the impact was communicated publicly. Emergency services have been notified and there are preexisting plans in place.

7.3 Councillor R. Donauer - Pothole Patching and Repairing

Councillor Donauer asked why there does not appear to be as many crews on the streets this year, compared to other years.

General Manager, Transportation and Utilities Jorgenson indicated that service levels have not changed. He noted that there was one-time, extra funding put to the pothole program a few years ago. He spoke to the work schedule and volume of potholes that have been repaired to date.
