In August 2008, the City Planning and Development Services Branches of the Community Services Department merged to become the Planning and Development Branch. This branch works with the community and City Council to establish both long range and current planning objectives for the City. Working together provides a more focused approach to achieving our planning goals and improves the efficiency and level of service provided to the community.

The Business License Program, within the Community Services Department, licenses all businesses operating from a fixed address in Saskatoon. This includes all home based businesses as well as businesses operating from commercial and industrial locations.

The Business Profile Annual Report provides a summary of business activity in Saskatoon, including information on new businesses, commercial/industrial businesses, and home based businesses. All data contained within this

publication was obtained by the City of Saskatoon through the Business License Program. All licensed businesses have been classified based on their primary business activity according to the North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS). Total Licensed Businesses

The City of Saskatoon Business License Program requires all businesses to obtain a license prior to starting operations. In 2008, there were 8,455 businesses licensed by the program.




Figure 1: Total Licensed Businesses, 2004–2008

Figure 1 reflects the overall business growth in Saskatoon and identifies the total number of home based and commercial/industrial businesses licensed from 2004 to 2008. The total number of businesses has increased by nearly 17% since 2004.



The Business License Program supports economic growth and community planning decisions by providing statistical information relating to business activity in Saskatoon. The type of information available upon request includes, but is not limited to the following:

- square footage of commercial/industrial space
- · employment figures
- specific data by business type, such as geographic distribution, new business listings, number of closed businesses




Figure 2: Total Licensed Businesses by Major Sector, 2008

Saskatoon's total licensed businesses can be divided into two major sectors: (1) goods and (2) services. As shown in Figure 2, Saskatoon's economy is primarily made up of servicesproducing businesses.

Table 1 provides a breakdown of all licensed businesses in Saskatoon by goods and services-producing sectors as well as NAICS sectors for the years 2004 to 2008.

In 2008, the largest sector was Trade, which includes both wholesale and retail and accounts for 23% of all licensed businesses. An increase of 2% over last year brought the Construction sector up to 15% of all licensed businesses.




Figure 3: Top 7 Sectors of Total Licensed Businesses, 2008

The top seven sectors make up 81% of the total number of licensed businesses in Saskatoon. Figure 3 is a breakdown of the top seven sectors; the remaining seven sectors are combined into the "All Other Sectors" category.

New Businesses




Figure 4: New Licensed Businesses, 2004-2008

The City of Saskatoon Business License Program issued 1,172 new business licenses in 2008. Figure 4 summarizes the number of new licenses issued for the years 2004 to 2008. The number of new home based businesses continues to exceed the number of new commercial/industrial businesses; however, new commercial/industrial businesses increased by 26%, while new home based businesses increased by 16%.

Saskatoon is Saskatchewan's largest city with an estimated population of 209,400 at the end of 2008.

Saskatoon has had an average of 932 new licensed businesses per year for the past five years.

In Summer 2009, the Business License Program will be launching an electronic business directory on City of Saskatoon's website.

Commercial/Industrial Businesses

In 2008, Saskatoon had a total of 5,506 licensed commercial/industrial businesses representing 65% of all businesses. Table 4 provides a breakdown of businesses by NAICS sector for the years 2004 to 2008. The data indicates that this distribution has been consistent over the past five years. The Trade and Other Services sectors continue to be the most prevalent; however, the largest percentage increase was in the Mining, Oil and Gas Extraction sector, growing 56% over last year.




Figure 5: Distribution of Commercial/Industrial Businesses by Neighbourhood, 2008

Commercial/Industrial Businesses by Neighbourhood

Figure 5 illustrates the distribution of commercial/industrial businesses in Saskatoon by neighbourhood. The neighbourhoods with the greatest number of commercial/industrial businesses are Central Business District (925), North Industrial (701), Hudson Bay Industrial (439), and Airport Business Area (381). The top sectors found in Central Business District were Trade (25%), Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services (14%), and Health Care and Social Assistance (13%). The top sectors found

in North Industrial are Trade (38%), Manufacturing (13%), and Other Services (13%).

A more detailed breakdown of the number of commercial/industrial businesses by neighbourhood can be found in Appendix 2.

Neighbourhoods with the highest number of new commercial/industrial businesses in 2008 were Central Business District (64), North Industrial (50), Airport Business Area (31), and Hudson Bay Industrial (25).

New Commercial/Industrial Businesses

The Business License Program issued 416 new commercial/industrial business licenses in 2008. This is a 26% increase from the previous year and represents 35% of all new business licenses issued. Table 5 shows the number of approved new commercial/industrial business license applications by NAICS sector for 2004 through 2008. Each year, the Trade sector consistently has the greatest number of new licenses issued, accounting for 32% of all new commercial/industrial businesses in 2008.

Home Based Businesses

In 2008, there were a total of 2,949 licensed home based businesses in Saskatoon. The proportion of home based businesses has grown steadily over the past five years. There are 1.5% more home based businesses this year than last year and they now account for 35% of the total number of licensed businesses in Saskatoon.

Table 6 provides the total number of home based businesses by NAICS sector for the years 2004 to 2008. The data in Table 6 indicates that the Construction sector and the Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services sector continue to be the most prevalent. Significant increases can also be seen in the Information, Culture, and Recreation sector and the Business, Building, and Other Support Services sector. A more detailed breakdown of the total number of home based businesses by NAICS sub-sector can be found in Appendix 3.




Figure 6: Number of Licensed Home Based Businesses by Neighbourhood, 2008

Home Based Businesses by Neighbourhood

Figure 6 illustrates the total number of licensed home based businesses by neighbourhood. The neighbourhoods with the greatest number of home based businesses are Silverwood Heights (178), Silverspring (110), Confederation Park (92), Lakeview (91), and Briarwood (86).

Neighbourhoods with the highest number of new home based businesses in 2008 are Silverwood Heights (29), Confederation Park (25), and Lakeview (23). The top sectors found in Silverwood Heights are Construction (30%), Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services (21%), and Other Services (12%). The top sectors found in Silverspring are Construction (32%), Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services (21%), and Administrative and Support, Waste Management, and Remediation Services (12%). A more detailed breakdown of the number of home based businesses by neighbourhood can be found in Appendix 4.

New Home Based Businesses

The Business License Program issued 756 new home based business licenses, representing 65% of all new business licenses issued in 2008. Table 7 shows the number of new home based business license applications by NAICS sector for 2004 through 2008. The Construction sector had the greatest number of new licenses issued, accounting for 41% of all new home based businesses.
