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
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The Community Services Department's Planning and Development Branch is responsible for overall land use planning and development activity for the City of Saskatoon. The primary goals of the branch are to build an increasingly sustainable community that is consistent with the vision and core strategies of the City's Strategic Plan, and, by so doing, to enhance the quality of life for Saskatoon's residents.

Through community engagement and consultation, the branch seeks to understand the values of the community and reflect those values through the implementation of development policies, programs, bylaws, and standards.

The Planning and Development Branch, Business License Program, licenses all businesses operating from a fixed address within Saskatoon. This includes all home based businesses as well as businesses operating from commercial and industrial locations.

The Business Profile Annual Report provides a summary of business activity in Saskatoon, including information on new businesses, commercial/industrial businesses, and home based businesses. All data contained within this publication was obtained by the City of Saskatoon through the Business License Program. All licensed businesses have been classified based on their primary business type or activity according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). Total Licensed Businesses




Figure 1: Total Licensed Businesses, 2005-2009

The City of Saskatoon Business License Program requires all businesses to obtain a license prior to operating. In 2009, there were 8,795 businesses licensed by the program. Figure 1 illustrates the overall business growth in

Saskatoon and identifies the total number of home based and commercial/industrial businesses licensed from 2005 to 2009. The total number of businesses has increased by nearly 21% since 2005.

The Business License Program collects and handles all personal information in accordance with *The Local Authority Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.




Figure 2: Total Licensed Businesses by Major Sector, 2009

Saskatoon's total licensed businesses can be divided into two major sectors: (1) goods-producing and (2) services-producing. As shown in Figure 2, Saskatoon's economy is primarily made up of services-producing businesses.

Table 1 provides a breakdown of all licensed businesses in Saskatoon by goods- and services-producing sectors as well as by NAICS sectors for the years 2005 to 2009.




Figure 3: Licensed Businesses by NAICS Sector, 2009

In 2009, the largest sector was trade, which includes both wholesale and retail and accounts for 22% of all licensed businesses. An increase of 9% over last year brought the construction

sector up to 16% of all licensed businesses. The top four sectors make up 62% of the total number of licensed businesses in Saskatoon. Figure 3 offers a breakdown of all sectors.

New Businesses




Figure 4: New Licensed Businesses, 2005-2009

The City of Saskatoon Business License Program issued 1,042 new business licenses in 2009. Figure 4 illustrates the number of new licenses issued for the years 2005 to 2009. The number of new home based businesses continues to exceed the number of new commercial/industrial businesses.

Commercial/Industrial Businesses

In 2009, Saskatoon had a total of 5,582 licensed commercial/industrial businesses representing 63% of all businesses. Table 4 provides a breakdown of businesses by NAICS sector for the years 2005 to 2009. The data indicates that this distribution has been consistent over the past five years. The trade and other services sectors continue to be the most prevalent; however, the largest percentage increase was in the construction sector, which increased by 11% last year.

Commercial/Industrial Businesses by Neighbourhood




Figure 5: Distribution of Commercial/Industrial Businesses by Neighbourhood, 2009

Figure 5 illustrates the distribution of commercial/industrial businesses in Saskatoon by neighbourhood. The neighbourhoods with the greatest number of commercial/industrial businesses are Central Business District (907), North Industrial (715), Hudson Bay Industrial (443), and Airport Business Area (387).

The top sectors found in Central Business District were trade (25%), professional, scientific, and technical services (14%), and health care and social assistance (13%). The top sectors

found in North Industrial are trade (38%), other services (13%), and manufacturing (12%).

Neighbourhoods with the greatest number of new commercial/industrial businesses in 2009 were Central Business District (56), North Industrial (42), Airport Business Area (31), and Hudson Bay Industrial (26).

New Commercial/Industrial Businesses

The Business License Program issued 352 new commercial/industrial business licenses in 2009. This represents 34% of all new business licenses issued. Table 5 shows the number of new commercial/industrial business license applications by NAICS sector for 2005 through 2009. The trade sector, which consistently has the greatest number of new licenses issued, accounted for 28% of all new commercial/industrial businesses in 2009.

Home Based Businesses

In 2009, there were a total of 3,213 licensed home based businesses in Saskatoon. The proportion of home based businesses has grown steadily over the past five years. There are 9% more home based businesses this year than last year and they now account for 37% of the total number of licensed businesses in Saskatoon.

Table 6 summarizes the total number of home based businesses by NAICS sector for the years 2005 to 2009. The data in Table 6 indicates that the construction sector and the professional, scientific, and technical services sector continue to be the most prevalent. A significant increase of 19% over the last year can also be seen in the trade sector. A more detailed breakdown of the total number of home based businesses by NAICS sub-sector can be found in Appendix 3, page 10.

Home Based Businesses by Neighbourhood




Figure 6: Distribution of Licensed Home Based Businesses by Neighbourhood, 2009

Figure 6 illustrates the total number of licensed home based businesses by neighbourhood. The neighbourhoods with the greatest number of home based businesses are Silverwood Heights (178), Silverspring (112), Lakeview (102), Briarwood (95), and Confederation Park (92). Neighbourhoods with the greatest number of new home based businesses in 2009 are College Park (25), Confederation Park (24), Nutana (23), Lakeview (23), and Silverwood Heights (23).

The most prevalent sector in Silverwood Heights, Silverspring, and Lakeview is construction, followed closely by varying combinations of professional, scientific, and technical services; other services; and business, building, and other support services. A more detailed breakdown of the total number of home based businesses by neighbourhood can be found in Appendix 4, page 11.

New Home Based Businesses

The Business License Program issued 690 new home based business licenses in 2009, representing 66% of all new business licenses issued. Table 7 shows the number of new home based business license applications by NAICS sector for 2005 through 2009. The construction sector had the greatest number of new licenses issued, accounting for 34% of all new home based businesses.
