



About PELICAN LAKE FIRST NATION

The Pelican Lake First Nation (PLFN) is located on Chitek Lake, Saskatchewan. The Pelican Lake First Nation is one of three First Nations that comprise the Agency Chiefs Tribal Council. Pelican Lake First Nation is located approximately 274km northwest of Saskatoon.

HIGHLIGHTS AND OPPORTUNITIES

- Pelican Lake First Nation (Chachakew Sakahikan) is a member of Treaty 6 and became a signatory in 1889.
- Pelican Lake is comprised of five land parcels that cover more than 30 thousand acres.
- Under the current Treaty Land Entitlement (TLE) structure, the band is entitled to a total of 45,345 acres of land.
- Pelican Lake has purchased .42 acres of land in the City of Saskatoon that is intended for a future Urban Reserve designation. This site includes Adam’s Lumber.
- Pelican Lake Businesses include the Chitek Lake Indian Development Company Ltd., Chamakese Summer Resort, Citek Lake Houseboats Ltd., Pelican Lake Trucking Ltd., Junior Farms Ltd., Penn General Store Ltd., and Pelican Lake Mini-mall.

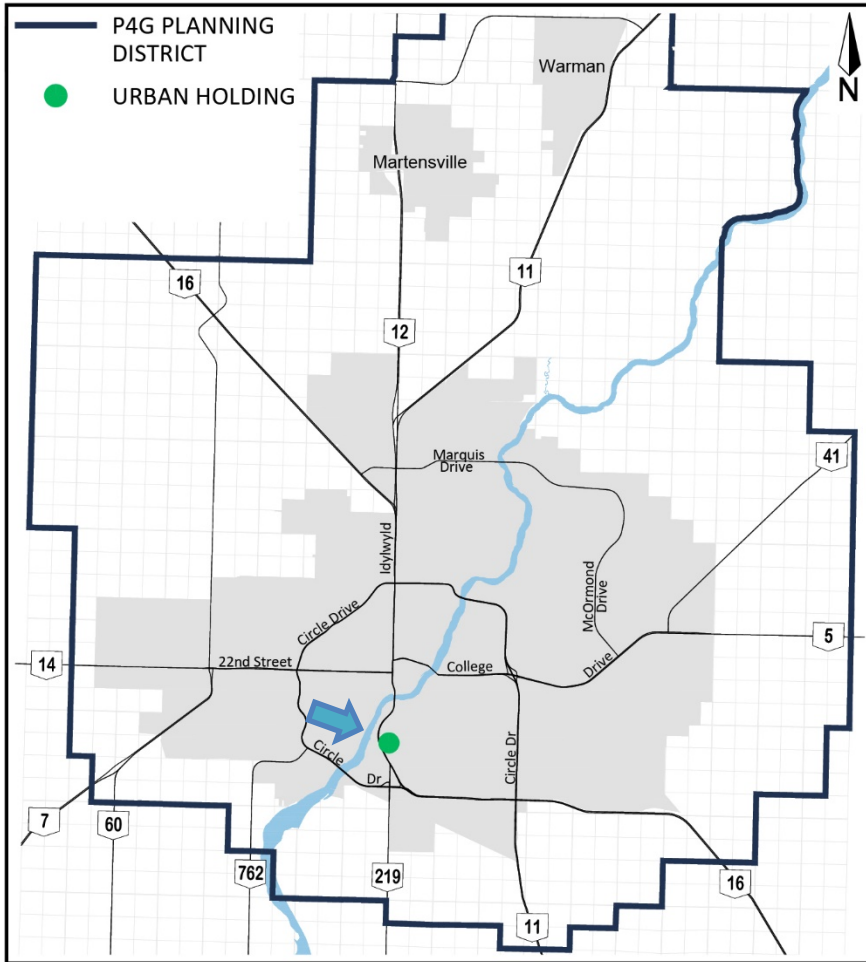

HOME RESERVE INFORMATION

Location

The home reserve is located adjacent to Chitek Lake, approximately 274km northwest of Saskatoon.

Services

Facilities on reserve include community infrastructure such as schools, a firehall, and a health clinic. Pelican Lake First Nation has a social development office, band office, work shop, two schools, Treaty Land Entitlement office and maintenance outbuildings.

Education

Pelican Lake First Nation has two schools, including the Pelican Lake First Nation School and the Chamakese Education Centre. The Chamakese Education Centre provides education to students from kindergarten to grade 6. The Pelican Lake First Nation School provides education to students in grades 7 through 12. Together, both schools have approximately 700 students enrolled currently. Pelican Lake's schools are part of the Treaty Six Education Council where the goal is to create cultural pride through academic achievement and success which instills lifelong
