They offer additional products and services including pet adoption, licensing, training, education and care products.

Seek

Recruit help and search for your pet. Call and whistle to your pet or carry an object that normally attracts your pet's attention like a toy or a can of treats that can be rattled.

Post a sign on your lawn with a picture of your pet so neighbours know he/she is missing and where to return him/her.

Place your dog's blanket or toys and your cat's litterbox outside. Familiar scents may attract your pet and lead him/her back home.

Shout it out!

Post a photograph and description of your pet on social media and share with friends, family and local lost pet groups.

Create a flyer with a photograph and description and post at local pet stores, on telephone poles, libraries and around your neighbourhood.

PET ADOPTION

Each adoption includes:

- Spay/neuter surgery
- Microchip (a small scannable ID)
- A complimentary veterinary health examination at a participating clinic of your choice
- Introductory Petplan Insurance (4 weeks)
- Deworming
- Up-to-date vaccinations

LICENSING

LICENSING PROVIDES PEACE OF MIND

If your pet ever escapes, a valid pet license provides:

- Identification
- Safe shelter
- Direct return home
- Non-licensed pets face fines starting at \$250

WHAT YOUR LICENSE PAYS FOR

- Bylaw enforcement
- Subsidized Spay & Neuter Program (SSNP)
- Pound services
- City-wide pet events
- Dog Park programming and development

LICENSING YOUR PET

- Dogs and cats (indoor and outdoor) over four months old require a valid license
- Licenses are valid for a 12-month period
- Discounted licenses are available to pets under 1 years old and spayed or neutered pets
- Licenses can be purchased or renewed online at saskatoon.ca/petlicensing
- Pet licenses can be purchased from locations across Saskatoon including City Hall and Saskatoon SPCA. A list of pet license vendors is available at saskatoon.ca/petlicensing

SUBSIDIZED SPAY & NEUTER PROGRAM

 A program designed to help low income families in Saskatoon get their cats and dogs spayed or neutered





As Saskatoon strives to become the most pet-friendly city in Canada, the City of Saskatoon Animal Services helps ensure that both pet owners and non-pet owners feel safe and welcome. Animal Services encompasses all aspects of pet ownership including pet licensing, off-leash Dog Parks, enforcement of animal control bylaws and pet specific events.

CITY OF SASKATOON DOG PARKS

Enjoy some off-leash time with your dog at one of the City of Saskatoon's 11 Dog Parks. Dog Parks are naturalized spaces where dogs are permitted to be off-leash while under the control of their owner. This allows both owner and dog to enjoy exercise together while socializing with others. A valid dog license is required to access any Dog Park. Unlicensed pets will be ticketed.

TIPS FOR RESPONSIBLE DOG OWNERS:

- Dogs must stay ON LEASH in all areas of the city unless clearly designated (signed) as an off-leash Dog Park.
- Be considerate and courteous to other people and children enjoying the outdoors and keep in mind that not everyone is comfortable around dogs, even friendly ones.

THE CITY OF SASKATOON ANIMAL CONTROL BYLAW REQUIRES:

- All dogs and cats (indoor and outdoor) over four months old require a valid license.
- Dogs and cats may not be at large.
- · Owners must clean up after their pets.



At the end of Broadway Avenue, south of Glasgow Street.

CASWELL

Avenue F North or Avenue G North and 31st Street West.

CHIEF WHITECAP

Accessed via Saskatchewan Crescent off of Cartwright Street.

FRED MENDEL

Avenue W South and 17th Street West.

HAMPTON VILLAGE

5 North of 33rd Street, along Junor Avenue, around Hampton Circle, north on Dawson Way, follow grid. Dog Park next to airport. HYDI

Enter North Gate from Slimmon Road. Alternate South Gate (foot traffic only).

PAUL MOSTOWAY

Richardson Road, east of McClocklin Road.

PIERRE RADISSON

Between 33rd Street and 32nd Street at Faulkner Crescent.

SILVERWOOD

Access off Kinnear Avenue or the east end of Adilman Drive.

SOUTHWEST

North of Cedar Villa Road off Valley Road.

SUTHERLAND BEACH

Accessed via grid road with entry off of Central Avenue, 50 m north of Attridge Drive.
