Current Activities

Roller Compacted Concrete (RCC) of Snow Melt Pad

As part of the Snow Management Facility, a snow melt pad which spans an area of approximately 8 acres, will be covered with roller compacted concrete (RCC) in preparation for future snow melt. This is similar to asphalt paving, however RCC is a special type of concrete that will be mixed on site.

The RCC application to the snow melting pad is currently underway. Application is dependent on weather conditions so can occur either during the day or at night as conditions permit. This process is scheduled to take place over a 6 week period and completion is anticipated by the end of September 2015.

Construction of the Berm

Construction of the berm has been deferred to the fall and will resume late in September 2015, so the heavy equipment resources can be utilized to complete the RCC snow melt pad before winter.

Hamm Construction with the permission of the City of Saskatoon's Traffic Department will have planned, temporary, short road closures on Dundonald through the month of September 2015, to install a new water service and sanitary line.

About the Project

The Civic Operations Centre will co-locate the new Saskatoon Transit Operations Facility and the City's first Snow Management Facility. The new site located in Saskatoon's southwest quadrant, will provide direct access to Circle Drive South Bridge which will allow the City to move equipment, materials and vehicles more efficiently around the city.

The Transit Operations Facility will have room to store 224 City buses inside with capacity for future fleet growth. Among the features will be administrative offices, fare collection, fueling, wash lanes, maintenance bays and inspections pits. The Snow Management Facility will have the capacity to store up to 1 million cubic metres of snow and will feature a meltwater collection site where the environmental safety of meltwater can be monitored prior to release into the storm sewer system.

A visual berm will be constructed between the CN Railway and the Montgomery Place neighbourhood. Traffic signal lights will be installed at the intersection of Valley Road and Landfill Road to ensure safe and efficient traffic flows.
