What to bring:

- current ID
- a device if you have one (phone, tablet, etc.) but not required
- any formal documents issued by the Federal government
- business numbers if you have a business located on the Road
- account numbers and/or bills for services you want help with

Important!

Adding the symbol (sometimes referred to as a circumflex or macron) above the "a" and "o" in wâhkôhtowin can be done on any device (e.g. phone, tablet, computer). You don't need to use these symbols when you type your address, or provide it to others or organizations/businesses to use. Your mail, parcels and deliveries will still be delivered without them.

miyo-wâhkôhtowin Road **Changing Your Address to** miyo-wâhkôhtowin Road

Introduction

On June 28, 2021, Saskatoon City Council approved the process to rename John A. Macdonald Road to recognize the ongoing harm in the community experienced by residential schools. The City of Saskatoon (City) is committed to raising awareness and understanding of residential schools and their ongoing impacts.

Why a New Name

John A. Macdonald, the first prime minister of Canada, played a significant role in the development of Canada's Indian residential school system. Residential schools took Indigenous children away from their families, cultures and languages to assimilate them - so they would no longer exist as distinct peoples.

Residential schools were responsible for the hunger, neglect, abuse and death of thousands of Indigenous children in Canada. Indigenous families today continue to experience this pain, grief, loss and inter-generational trauma.

The New Name: miyo-wâhkôhtowin Road

The City met with Indigenous leaders, Residential School Survivors, Elders, Knowledge Keepers and youth, the Saskatoon Intercultural Association, members from the Chinese community, teachers from wâhkôhtowin School and others to recommend a new name for the Road to the City of Saskatoon's Civic Naming Committee. The name was approved by City Council on September 27, 2023.

The name is miyo-wâhkôhtowin Road - Cree for good (miyo) relationship (wâhkôhtowin). It is pronounced mee-yo wah-KOH-toh-win (visit saskatoon.ca/engage to hear the name pronounced). The name reflects the theme of Reconciliation and was thoughtfully and carefully chosen after listening to and learning from the community and the people that continue to be impacted by residential schools and the legacy of John A. Macdonald. Residential schools contributed to a breakdown of relationships within the community, causing division; good relationships will bring us together.

Timeframe January 15, 2024: Address change officially takes place through Canada Post.



Tasks completed by the City of Saskatoon - No Action Required

The City has notified Saskatchewan Government Insurance (SGI) about the address change. Residents will automatically receive their updated driver's licence and/or non-drivers photo ID with their new address from SGI. Please expect to receive it by the end of January 2024. If you have not received your new photo ID by that time, contact SGI at splinguiries@sgl.sk.ca or tollfree at **1-844-855-2744**. If you have a Package Policy or additional auto insurance, please contact the SGI Canada insurance broker that issued the policy to notify them of the address change.

We have notified Canada Post of your new address so that they can update their database. To ease the transition, Canada Post will provide you with free mail forwarding service for 1 year to ensure that mail and parcels with your old address are automatically redirected to your new address, without any delays. This free service will end on **January 15, 2025**. A supply of postage-paid Change of Address cards are available for pick up at your local Post Office. Please keep in mind, some organizations that use Canada Post's address data may require some time to update their systems with your new mailing address. This means that it may take several weeks before these organizations will be able to recognize your new address and allow you to update it with them.

Emergency Services

Police, fire and ambulance services have been notified of the address change. No action is required from residents.

Express Address

Select 'sign up to create an account' and enter your new address information. Alternatively, you can notify organizations individually by phone, email, or through their website.
