

FIRE STATION NO. 10



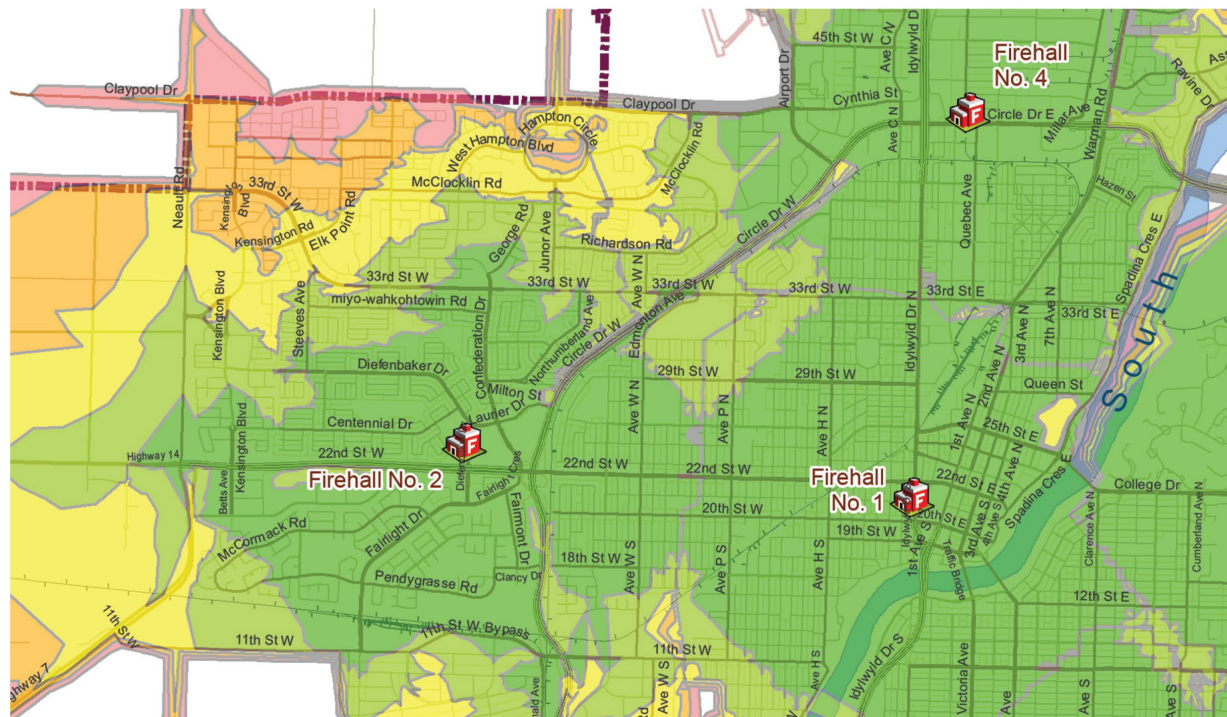
COMMUNITY RESPONSE



- Over 25,000 emergency responses reported in 2024.
- Station No. 1 on Idylwyld Drive and Station No. 2 on Diefenbaker Drive accounted for over half of those incidents.
- SFD is planning for two fire stations on the northwest and southwest corners of the city to help improve response times on the west side of Saskatoon.








CURRENT STATION COVERAGE



Legend

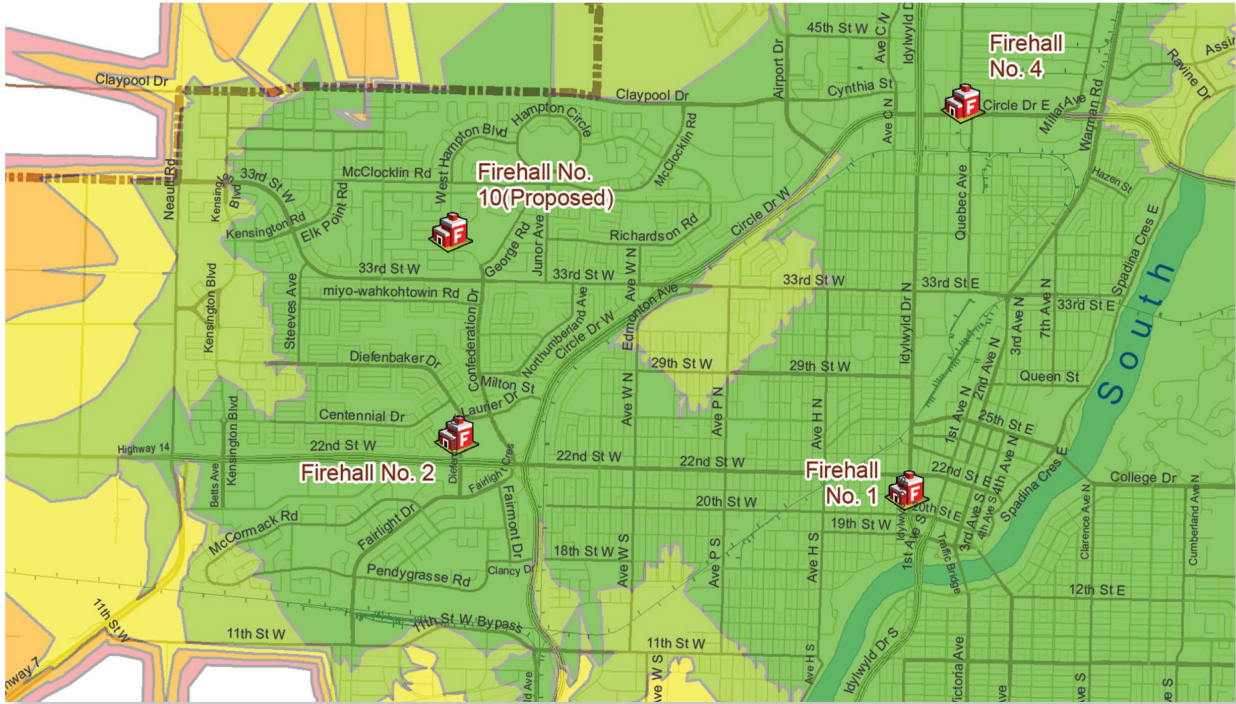

PROPOSED SITE



- SFD is proposing a new fire station on Hunt Road in Dundonald Park.
- Fire Station No. 10 will improve coverage across the communities in the northwest corner of the city.



PROPOSED SITE



STATION NO. 10



- Approximately 5,877 sq ft or 586 sq metres
- 2 bays
- 1 pumper truck
- 5 firefighter-paramedics on duty 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- 8 parking stalls



CONSIDERATIONS

Station Footprint

- Proposed 5,877sqft or 586 sq metres.
- Care was taken to minimize disruption to the green space.

Parking

- Approximately 3 parking spaces along Hunt Road will be used to provide access to the station's driveway and parking lot.
- Design aims to keep number of affected parking spaces to a minimum.

Noise

- Sirens are often used closest to the emergency location, not when initially dispatched.
- During typical off-hours, such as evenings, sirens are generally not needed.

Traffic

- There will not be any noticeable impact to traffic in the neighbourhood.



CONSIDERATIONS

Construction

- Construction is expected to take approximately 14-18 months.
- Construction will begin in 2026 with the goal of having the station operational in 2027.

Safety

- The construction site will be secured with site fencing.
- Construction is not expected to affect the sports field or playgrounds and children will still be able to play in the park.

Sports Programming

- The current sports field will not be impacted by the proposed new fire station.
