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CORRIDOR GROWTH UPDATES

The Corridor Planning program continues to gather feedback from the Pedestrian Experience Survey, which entails taking a survey of your experiences as a pedestrian after walking a section of 8th Street E or 22nd Street W. Thank you to everyone who has contributed so far! If you would like to post photos on the social media platform of your choice, use the hashtag: #yxecorridors.

The Corridor team is also preparing for a few public engagement events. The next major event will be in late-2018, and will build on what we've already heard by presenting concepts and options for transforming our major corridors. The team is also planning to host two smaller pop-up events, one along 8th Street and another on 22nd Street. Both of these events will be at popular, family-friendly locations. These events are slated for August and will revolve around high-level ideas about what these corridors could eventually look like, from the pedestrian perspective. Stay tuned for a short-notice announcement of where and when the pop-up events will be held!

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The City's consultant is expected to submit the first draft report for the Transit Village Concept Plans in the coming weeks. Once received, the City will begin a comprehensive stakeholder engagement process. The project team will coordinate with internal staff, landowners, members of the public, and other stakeholders to seek feedback on the plans.

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The Brownfield Renewal Strategy team is continuing to transition the project from Phase 1 to Phase 2. June saw City Council's approval of a contract extension with our technical expert, which will see them complete brownfield assessment work along the proposed Blue Line BRT Corridor. This work will provide a complete picture of the brownfield status along the proposed BRT network corridors – Red, Green and Blue Lines.

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Funding for many of these projects is provided through the Public Transit Infrastructure Fund (PTIF) from the Government of Canada and the City of Saskatoon. The Government of Saskatchewan administers federal PTIF funding in the province.
