Purchasing a Permit

Permits can be purchased at City Hall Corporate Revenue in the main lobby. City Hall is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday to Friday (excluding statutory holidays). Accepted forms of payment are cash and debit.

Renewal and Application Checklist:

Please bring the following documents when purchasing a permit:

☐ Driver's licence

■ Vehicle registration

☐ Utility bill OR lease agreement with address

☐ For multi-unit non-conforming dwellings: current and dated landlord or property management letter on corporate letterhead stating that no off-street parking is available

If the resident is not the registered owner of the vehicle but is the principal operator, the person must sign an affidavit declaring they are the principal operator of the vehicle.

Persons driving corporate vehicles must provide proof of employment with, or ownership of, the corporation. Acceptable forms of documentation include: an employment contract, a letter on corporate letterhead signed by a company official, shareholder agreement or business card.

Change of Address or Vehicle

If a permit holder changes their address or plate number, they must update their permit (at no charge). If the permit is no longer required because of relocation or sale/disposal of a vehicle, the permit must be returned or destroyed with confirmation provided to the City.

Lost or Stolen Permits


If the permit is lost, the holder may re-apply to the City for a new permit at regular cost. A stolen permit will be replaced at no cost; however, proof must be provided that the permit was stolen (i.e., insurance claim, police report).

Enforcement

Parking Enforcement regularly patrols RPP zones and responds to complaints about violations. Any vehicle parked on the street beyond the posted time limit may be ticketed if a valid residential, visitor or temporary parking permit is not displayed. Parking on a residential street is also limited to a maximum of 72 hours (without moving) with or without a permit. If you wish to report parking violations or permit abuse, call Parking Enforcement at 306-975-8344.

Residential Parking Program

The Residential Parking Program, regulated by Bylaw No. 7862, establishes parking zones in neighbourhoods where street parking is at a premium due to high demand from nearby businesses or institutions.

Time restrictions can vary and are posted on streets throughout the designated RPP zone. Eligible residents can purchase a parking permit which allows them to park their vehicle(s) near their homes beyond the posted time restriction. Any vehicle parked on the street beyond the posted time limit may be ticketed if a valid parking permit is not displayed.

All other parking regulations, such as loading zones, bus stops and no parking areas must be obeyed by permit holders. Permitted vehicles may be parked on the street for no more than 72 hours before being moved.

Permits will only be issued to vehicles weighing less than 8,000 kg and measuring less than 6 metres. By exception, residents can apply for a permit for larger recreational vehicles (i.e., motor home) but must adhere to the parking restrictions for such vehicles (i.e., parking up to 36 consecutive hours on a residential street after which it must be moved to an off-street location for at least 48 hours before parking on a residential street again).

Permits may be issued to applicants who reside in a one or two-unit dwelling, a semi-detached dwelling or a multiple-unit dwelling with up to four units. Residents in non-conforming multiple-unit dwellings with more than four units are also eligible for permits, as per Bylaw No. 7862. Contact parking.permits@sasktoon.ca to confirm if a multi-unit dwelling is considered non-conforming and eligible for permits.

You can notify Customer Service at revenue@saskatoon.ca or 306-975-2400 of any changes to license plates, on either new or existing vehicles, and a new permit will be issued at no cost.

Types of Residential Parking Permits

There are four types of residential parking permits; they are as follows:

1. Residential Parking Program (RPP) Permit Valid within the Parking Permit Zone \$25 + GST/year

A RPP permit is available to eligible residents in one to four-unit dwellings, with no more than three permits issued per dwelling unit. Residents in non-conforming multi-unit dwellings are limited to one permit per resident and a maximum of two permits per unit. Permits are non-transferable, as the licence plate number is displayed on the permit. **Not for resale**.

2. Limited Residential Parking Program (LRPP) Permit Valid within the Limited Parking Permit Zone \$15 + GST/year

Like a RPP permit, a LRPP permit is available to eligible residents in one to four-unit dwellings, with no more than three permits issued per dwelling unit. Residents in non-conforming multi-unit dwellings are limited to one permit per resident and a maximum of two permits per unit. Permits are non-transferable, as the licence plate number is displayed on the permit. Unlike RPP zones, LRPP zones are not continuously patrolled by Parking Enforcement. Residents must report concerns to 306-975-8344. **Not for resale**.

3. Visitor Parking Permit

Parking restricted to block faces (see diagram) \$25 + GST/year if in place of a residential permit \$5 + GST/year if in addition to a residential permit


A visitor parking permit is a transferable permit that can be provided to a guest while they are visiting. Residents of a RPP or LRPP zone may purchase a maximum of one visitor parking permit per eligible dwelling unit. Visitor parking permits are not available to residents who reside in non-conforming multiple unit dwellings with more than four units. The manager of a non-conforming multiple unit dwelling can apply to receive up to three visitor permits. **Not for resale**.

As shown in the diagram (below), a visitor parking permit is valid only for certain block faces. This includes the block face directly adjacent, opposite and facing to the left and right of the applicant's residence.

4. Temporary Parking Permit

Parking restricted to block faces (see diagram) \$1 + GST/day

Residents of an eligible dwelling unit, or a contractor, may purchase a temporary parking permit for up to 30 days in any permit year. A temporary parking permit is valid in the same block face areas as a visitor parking permit, as shown on the diagram. For example, a resident or contractor may obtain a temporary parking permit to park in front of a residence within a parking permit zone where work is taking place.
