Roadways Emergency Response Plan

Summary of the City of Saskatoon's approved Roadways plan for responding to a major snowstorm.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the emergency response plan is to guide the Roadways team through a phased approach in a major snowstorm to ensure public safety and restore mobility on Saskatoon streets and sidewalks.

RESPONSE PLAN

The Roadways Emergency Response plan will be activated immediately when:

- Snow accumulation is greater than 25 cm and/or combination of snow, freezing rain and wind; and
- 2. Mobility is reduced to the point that light vehicles cannot travel on city streets; mobility across the city is severely impacted, and the regular winter maintenance level of service applicable to typical winter snow events cannot be met.

PRIORITIES

- Reduce risk of serious collisions on high-speed and high-traffic streets and bridges.
- Provide critical services and access to emergency facilities and City services.
- **3.** Mobilize Saskatoon Transit to operate along key routes.
- **4.** Restore mobility on lower traffic streets.
- **5.** Restore parking availability and improvement of sight line

TIMELINE		
Phase	Timing	Action
1	First 12–24 Hours	Grading and plowing Priority 1 streets, access to emergency facilities, access to critical City services
2	36 hours	Grading major Saskatoon Transit routes including some Priority 2 streets
3	96 hours	Grading remaining Priority 2, and Priority 3 streets (includes school zones)
4	10 days	Grading local streets (7 days) and industrial areas (3 days); clearing major pedestrian pathways and cycling infrastructure
5	8 weeks	Removing stored snow for parking availability and improvement of sight lines city-wide

*From end of snowfall.

Priority 1 streets are freeways, major arterials and bridges.

Priority 2 streets are arterials with double-lanes, like Clarence Ave, McKercher Dr and Millar Ave; and Saskatoon Transit routes.

Priority 3 streets are collector streets, remainder of Business Improvement District streets and school zones. These streets take you through your neighbourhood, like Louise Ave, Howell Ave and Main St.
