

Traffic changes coming to King George and Holiday Park

Dear Residents,

The intersection at Spadina Crescent, 11th Street and Avenue H is closed for construction at the Water Treatment Plant. Over the next month, construction of the plant's perimeter security fence will start, which will essentially make the closure of the intersection permanent. Transportation infrastructure changes and improvements to the traffic flow within the area will be implemented over the next six months.

Transportation Infrastructure Changes

Traffic signal changes at the intersection of 11th Street and Avenue P, new signage along the detour route, and traffic calming infrastructure are planned to discourage short-cutting on residential streets between Avenue H and 11th Street.

Turn arounds will be constructed on Spadina Crescent between 11th Street and Dudley Street, and between the Gordie Howe Bridge and south of Schuyler Street.

Spring & Summer Construction

The next six months could be frustrating for drivers and residents. We are doing our best to coordinate various road and sidewalk projects planned in your neighbourhoods to keep the traffic restrictions in the area to a minimum this summer; however, some will require temporary detours.

Dundonald Avenue and Spadina Crescent will undergo reconstruction this summer before the turnaround is installed for the new access road to the SaskPower Queen Elizabeth Power Plant. During construction, the only access to the power plant may be Spadina Crescent from the north, and residents may notice an increase traffic along detour routes during this phase.

Construction work that affects your property will be communicated with a flyer in advance. Construction is expected to be completed by the end of summer 2019.

Water Treatment Plant Security Fence

The design of the enclosure ensures that neighborhood safety is at the forefront of the considerations, and that a balance is struck between the plant's requirements and neighborhood esthetics. Watch for more information over the next few months.
