

Backgrounder

Three water and wastewater projects in Saskatchewan receive government funding

The governments of Canada and Saskatchewan will each provide more than \$30.4 million for the following three infrastructure projects under the New Building Canada Plan's Provincial-Territorial Infrastructure Component—National and Regional Projects. Including the recipients' contributions, more than \$131.7 million will be invested in total.
