QUALIFICATION OF VOTERS / GENERAL VOTING RULES

You can vote in City of Saskatoon municipal elections if, on the
day of the election, you are:

- a **Canadian citizen**;
- **at least 18 years old**;
- a **resident of the City of Saskatoon** for at least three
consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the
election; and
- a **resident of the Province of Saskatchewan** for at least six
consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the
election.

If you don't live in Saskatoon but have owned assessable land
in Saskatoon for at least three consecutive months immediately
preceding the day of the election, you can vote for the Mayor
and Ward Councillor. You are not eligible to vote for the School
Boards if you do not live in the city. You can only vote **ONCE**
in a municipal election in Saskatoon, regardless of how many
properties you own.

In order to vote for the Separate School board in Saskatoon, you
must be of the religious faith of the minority that established
the Separate School Division which means you must be of the
Roman Catholic faith. If you are of the Ukrainian or Chaldean
Catholic rites, or your faith recognizes the Pope as the leader of
your church, you are considered to be a member of the minority
Catholic faith, thereby becoming an elector for the Roman
Catholic separate school board.

There is no Voters List. At your polling station, you
are required to provide appropriate identification
(see next page) and to sign a declaration that you are
eligible to vote.

* VOTER IDENTIFICATION

All voters must provide identification to be eligible to vote. The purpose of the voter identification is to establish the voter's identity and give evidence of residence. Government-issued photo identification is your best option but there are many ways to prove your identity and your residence.

OPTION 1:

- One original piece of identification that includes your photo, name and address.
- The identification must be issued by a federal, provincial, or municipal government, such as a Saskatchewan Driver's Licence.

If your identification does not meet these criteria it will not be recognized as an acceptable form of photo identification.

If you do not have a driver's licence, you may obtain photo identification from Saskatchewan Government Insurance.

OPTION 2:

- Two original pieces of information, both of which must contain your name and at least one that contains your address. Examples of acceptable identification options include a utility bill issued to you within the last six months, and a credit card statement.

- **NEW!** Use your smartphone to prove your identity and residence by showing, for example: your bank statement, utility bill or rental/lease agreement on your phone.

OPTION 3:

If you do not possess any form of acceptable identification you may have another voter vouch for you to verify your identity and address. In this case, the following requirements must be met:

- You must be accompanied by another voter who has acceptable identification;
- The voter who is vouching for you must be entitled to vote in Saskatoon; and
- A form to vouch for another voter must be completed. These forms are available at the polling station.

HOW TO VOTE

There is no Voters List. At your polling station, you will be required to sign a declaration that you are eligible to vote and to show the appropriate identification. You will be given one ballot containing the appropriate races for Mayor, Councillor and School Board Trustee, to be taken into a voting booth and filled out. After you have voted, the ballot will be fed into a vote-counting machine, which will automatically count the votes and issue the results after the polls have closed.

WHAT DOES RESIDENCY MEAN?

The residence of a person is the place where that person normally resides. A person who is temporarily absent from the place where he or she normally resides does not lose his or her residency. If a person has more than one home in the Province, that person must choose one as his or her residence.

NOT SURE WHERE TO VOTE ON ELECTION DAY? HERE'S HOW TO FIND OUT:

- Refer to the Ward maps on **pages 6-11** in this guide to find the Ward in which you reside, and the location of your poll.
- Poll boundaries run down the centre of the street or lane. If you live on the boundary, you will vote at the polling station on the same side of the boundary as where you live.

OR

Use the poll finder at saskatoon.ca/election2016 to find your poll. You will be asked to enter your home address. From there you will be provided with your poll number, location name and address. For example: *Poll 603, Nutana Collegiate, 411 - 11th Street East*

OR

Call the City Clerk's Office at 306-975-3240.

POLL LOCATION INFORMATION

- You may vote only at the poll location for the polling area in which you reside on Election Day. If you go to a poll other than that one, you will be directed to the proper poll.
- Before you vote, you will be asked to establish your identity, give evidence of your residence and complete a Voter's Registration Form.
- Poll locations will be open from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm on Election Day, Wednesday, October 26, 2016.
- If you reside outside of the City of Saskatoon but are eligible to vote for the municipal election because you own property within the city, you must vote in the poll in which the property is located.
- If you own more than one property in the city, you can only vote once. You must vote in the Ward where your highest assessable property is located.
- At your poll location you will be required to sign a declaration that you are eligible to vote.
- If you are a resident of Whitecap Dakota First Nation, you will vote for the Ward 7 Public School Board Trustee at Poll 706, Circle Drive Alliance Church, 3035 Preston Avenue South.

HOMEBOUND VOTING

City Council has established homebound voting for voters who, due to disability or limited mobility, are unable to leave their residence to vote at an established polling place. Their resident caregivers may also vote using this service.

Homebound voting will be conducted on October 21, 24 and 26.

If you wish to use this service, you need to fill out an application form and file it with the Returning Officer by no later than **Friday, October 14, 2016 at 5:00 pm**. Application forms are available on the City's website saskatoon.ca/election2016 or from the City Clerk's Office at City Hall, 222-3rd Avenue North, 306-975-3240. You will then be advised of the date and time an election official will visit your home to take your vote. When the election official visits your home, you will be required to provide identification. Government-issued photo identification is your best option but there are other alternatives available to you.

HOSPITAL VOTING

- FOR PATIENTS ON ELECTION DAY, OCTOBER 26

If you will be a patient in any of the Saskatoon hospitals on Election Day, you will have the opportunity to vote at the hospital.

There will be a stationary polling location in each hospital:

Royal University Hospital 5th Floor North Atrium, 9:00 am – 11:00 am

City Hospital 3rd Floor Atrium Bridge, 9:00 am – 11:00 am

St. Paul's Hospital 5th Floor Hub, 9:00 am – 11:00 am

Election day workers will also provide bedside voting to patients that are unable to vote at the hospital location. The workers will be going to patients' bedsides between 11:00 am and 4:00 pm.

To vote you will need to provide identification to establish your identity and give evidence of residence in Saskatoon. You will need either one piece of government issued photo i.d. such as a Saskatchewan Driver's Licence, or two pieces of identification, at least one of which establishes your place of residency. Patients at the hospitals can use their hospital wrist band for one piece of identification and then would be required to have another piece of identification that states their name and address, for example a utility statement or a blank cheque.

Voters who have surgery scheduled for October 26, 2016 could also vote in the Advance Polls prior to admission to hospital or request a mail-in ballot. To receive a mail-in ballot please proceed to the City Clerk's Office, City Hall and register before 5:00 pm October 25, 2016.

MAIL-IN BALLOT

If you are a qualified voter (**see page 2**) and you anticipate being unable to vote at an advance poll or on the day of the election, you can still participate in the 2016 municipal election by way of a mail-in ballot.

Qualified voters can apply to vote using a mail-in ballot. An application must be made in person at the City Clerk's Office, City Hall. **The last day to apply for a mail-in ballot is October 25, 2016 at 5:00 pm.** When you apply, you will be required to complete a Voters' Registration Form and produce the necessary voter identification. Photo identification, such as a Saskatchewan Driver's Licence or an SGI-issued identification card is the best option, but there are other options available.

The mail-in ballot packages will be mailed to you in October. The ballot package will contain:

- A ballot
- Instructions on how to complete the ballot
- Instructions on how to correctly return the ballot in the envelopes you have received
- A return envelope.

It is important that you carefully follow the instructions for completing and returning the envelope. Returned ballots which are not correctly filled out according to the instructions provided in the package will not be accepted by the Returning Officer to be counted on election night. Your ballot must be received by the Returning Officer by 8:00 pm on October 26, 2016 in order to be counted.

VOTING ASSISTANCE

If you need help to vote, you may bring a friend to assist you on Election Day, October 26, or use the AutoMARK Voter Assist Terminal during the Advance Polls at Market Mall and City Hall.

There are several options if you need assistance to vote:

Poll Location Support: All Polls, All Dates

- Election officials at each poll location are available to provide assistance to voters who have a physical disability, or who have difficulty reading or writing.
- Voters may also bring a friend with them to the poll location. After they sign a declaration, they may help you vote in any way you require.
- Magnifying devices are available at the poll locations upon request.



The AutoMARK Voter Assist Terminal (VAT) is an optical scan ballot-marking terminal that assists voters who are visually-impaired or have physical impairments that would make it difficult or impossible to mark a ballot in the usual way. It uses a touch screen to let voters mark paper ballots privately and independently, and is wheelchair accessible. Assistance options include:

- Rocker Paddle/Foot Switch - for voters with limited motor control
- Braille key pad - for voters who are blind or have limited visibility
- Audio Function - allows voters who are blind or have limited visibility to hear the choices
- A zoom feature that enables the voter to increase the font size of each office listed on the ballot
- Sip/Puff Device
